Beluga whales, often referred to as the canaries of the sea, are known for their beautiful and expressive vocalizations. They are among the most vocal of all cetaceans, with sounds that can be heard above water and through boat hulls. Remarkably, belugas are one of only two cetacean species capable of altering their facial expressions, allowing them to showcase playful "funny faces" as they produce various sounds.






