

The Carnac Stones, located in Brittany, France, comprise over 3,000 ancient standing stones dating back to the Neolithic period, around 3300 to 4500 BCE. As one of the largest collections of menhirs in the world, their true purpose remains a mystery. Some suggest they served as calendars or observatories, while local legend claims they are petrified Roman soldiers transformed by Merlin, the legendary wizard, under the orders of Pope Cornelius.




