# **National Teddy Bear Day**

Did you know that in 1902, President Theodore Roosevelt refused to shoot a bear cub while hunting in Mississippi? Clifford Berryman published a cartoon of the event in the Washington Post on November 16th, 1902, and the caricature became an instant classic.

A New York store owner named Morris Michtom created a new toy and even wrote to President Roosevelt to ask permission to name the new toy, "Teddy Bear." The rest, of course, is history. Tell a story about your favorite Teddy Bear, maybe you still have it.

In 1908, American aviator Orville Wright made the first one-hour airplane flight to Fort Meyer, Virginia. He and his brother Wilbur became interested in flight by a toy helicopter their father brought home when they were children. The Wright brothers invented the airplane in 1903.

#### **Enclave Nations**

Italy encircles two of these: Vatican City, the center of the Roman Catholic Church, and San Marino, a small state in the Apennine Mountains. The third enclave nation is Lesotho, which is surrounded by South Africa and has maintained its independence in part due to its mountainous and difficult-to-access terrain.


