On Christmas Eve 1947, George Orwell (born Eric Blair) was admitted to Hairmyres Hospital near Glasgow with chronic tuberculosis. At age 44, he was frustrated by his illness and wished he could write more. Despite his struggles, he managed to complete his famous novel Nineteen Eighty-Four, though he felt it was "a good idea ruined" by his declining health. His letters from 1948 until his death in January 1950 reflect his ongoing battle with illness.


