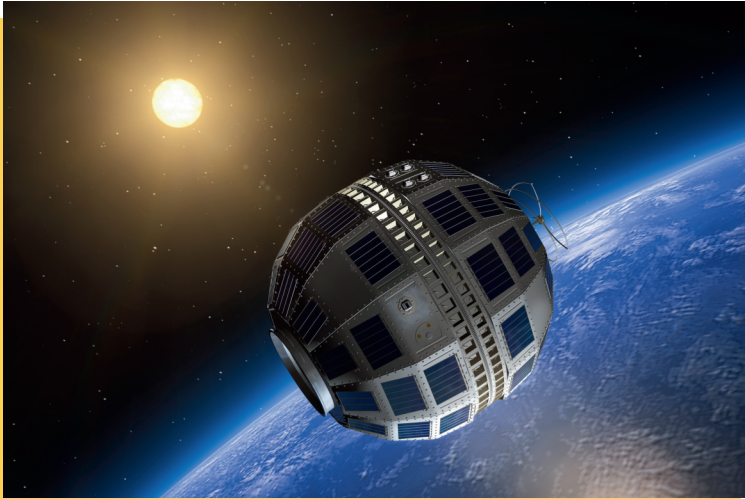


Today in History

Telstar and Television

On July 10, 1962, the launch of Telstar 1, the first active communications satellite, forever changed television. This privately funded satellite made history by relaying the first live transatlantic television signals between the United States and Europe. For the first time, audiences saw images like the Statue of Liberty and the Eiffel Tower broadcast instantaneously across the ocean, shrinking the world and ushering in a new era of global communication and live international news coverage.

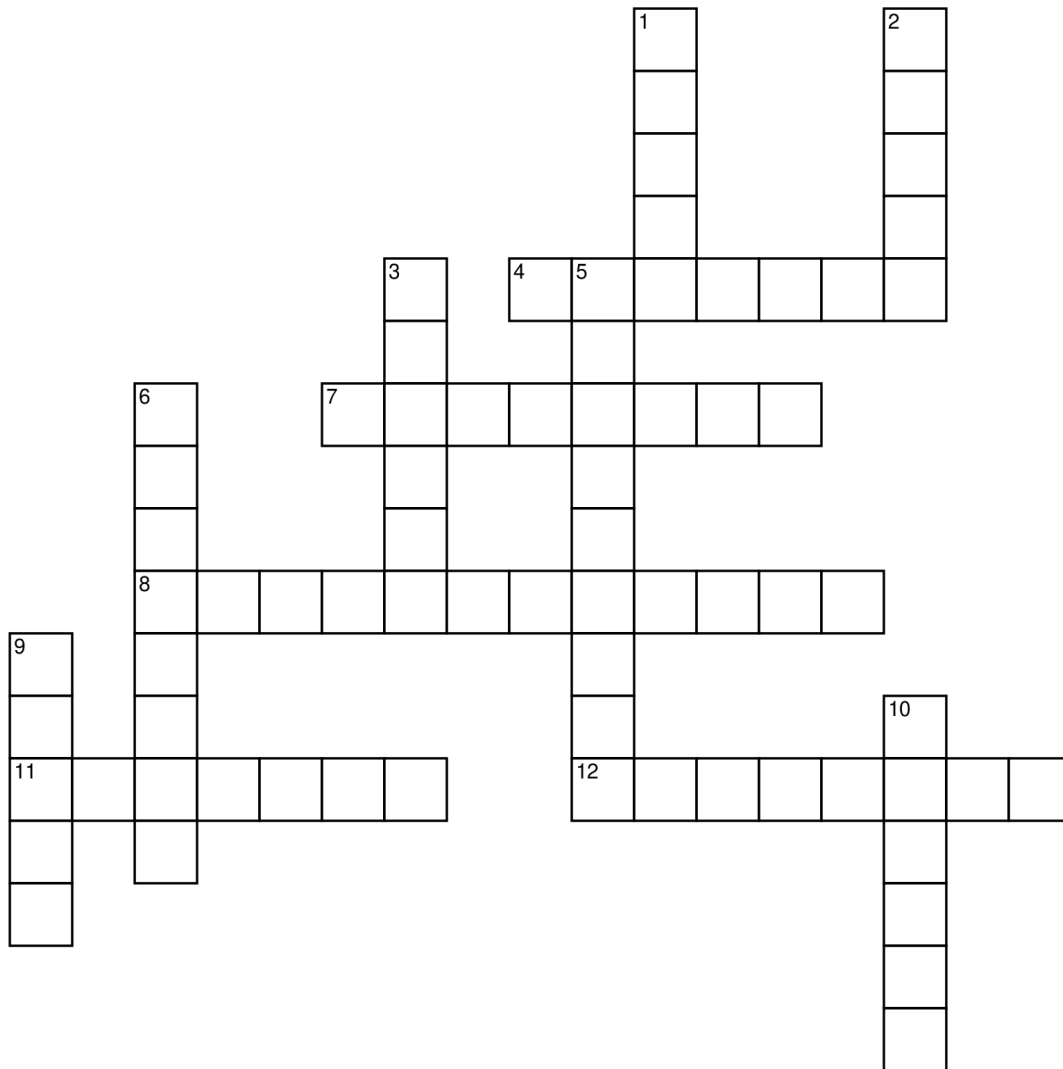

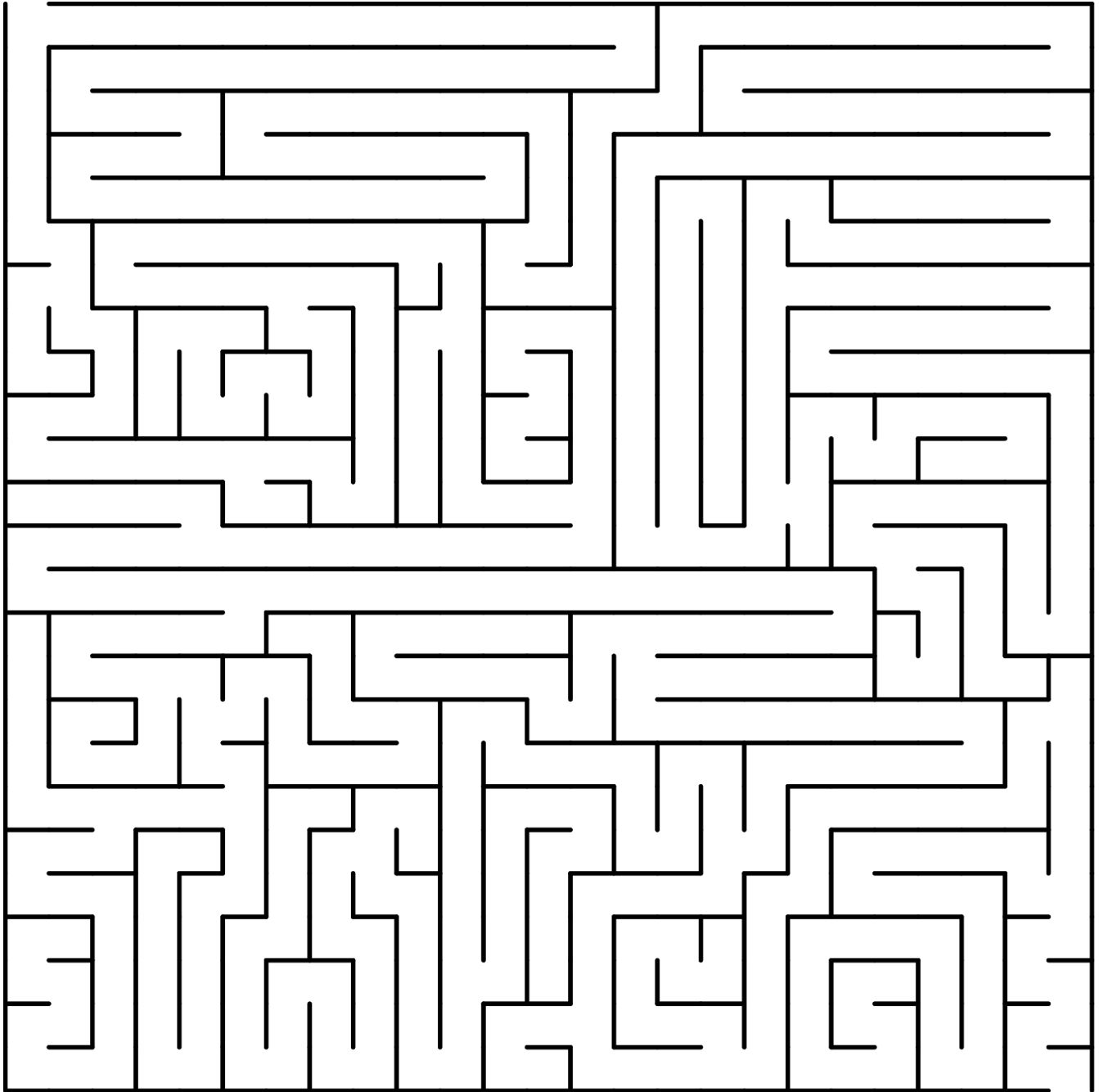

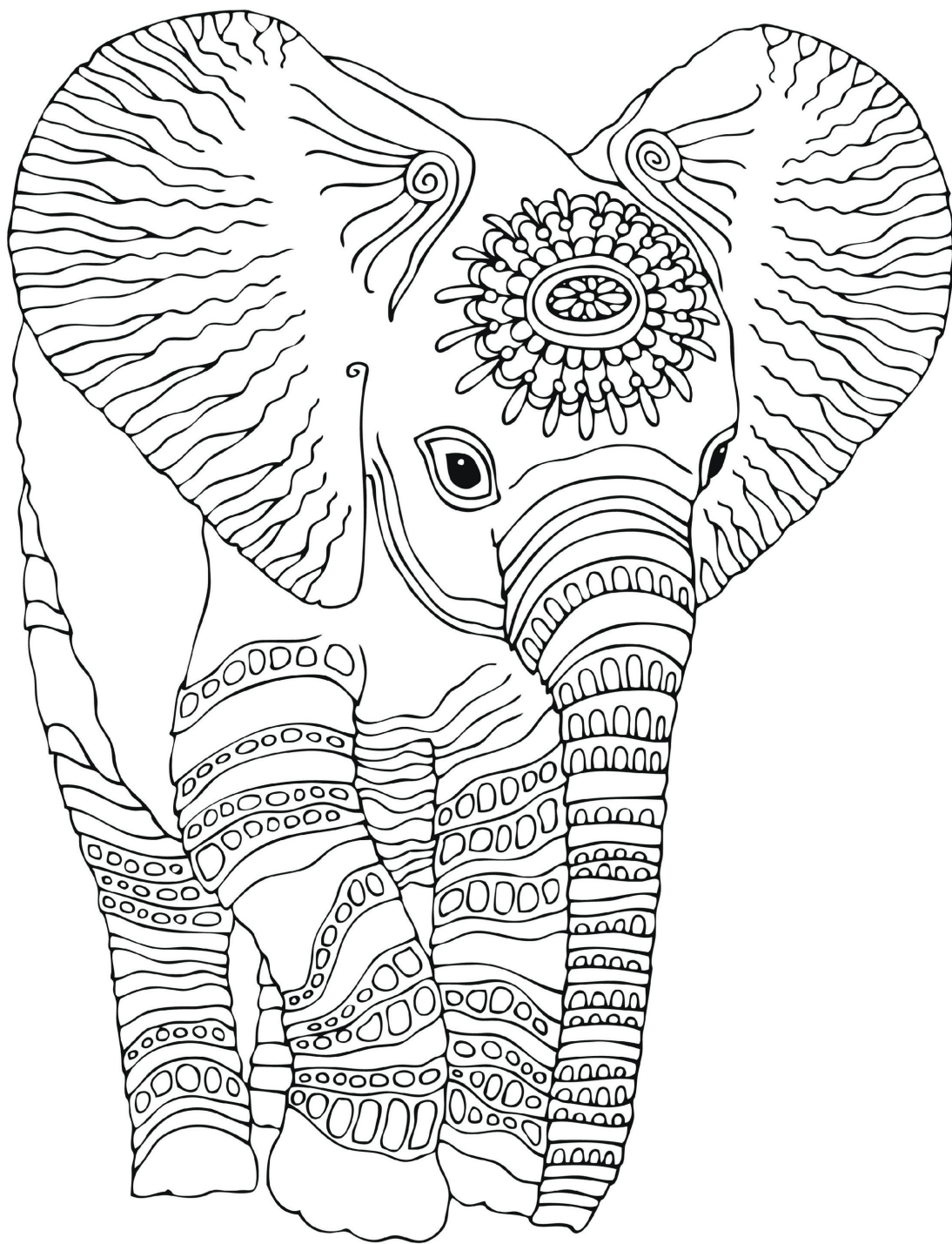
