## National Golf Lover's Day

The game of golf dates back to 15th-century Scotland, when players tried to hit a pebble over dunes. By the mid-18th century, it officially became a sport with annual competitions. At that time, the clubs the golfers used were nothing like the modern-day drivers, simple wooden clubs made of beech or hickory, and the balls were made of compressed feathers wrapped in a stitched horse hide. But by the end of the 19th century, golf was popular and was played almost everywhere. The United States Golf Association was officially set up in 1894.

In 1952, the PGA declared October 4th National Golf Day to raise money for charities by encouraging the professional members of the PGA to play golf with contributors. Each year, the PGA selects a top-ranked golfer to be chairman of the event.



## Today in History



In 1918, Mae West starred in the premiere of the musical “Sometime” in New York City. She performed in vaudeville and on stage before moving to Los Angeles to launch her film career in the 1930s. West’s humor and confident persona made her one of the highest-paid actors in the U.S.

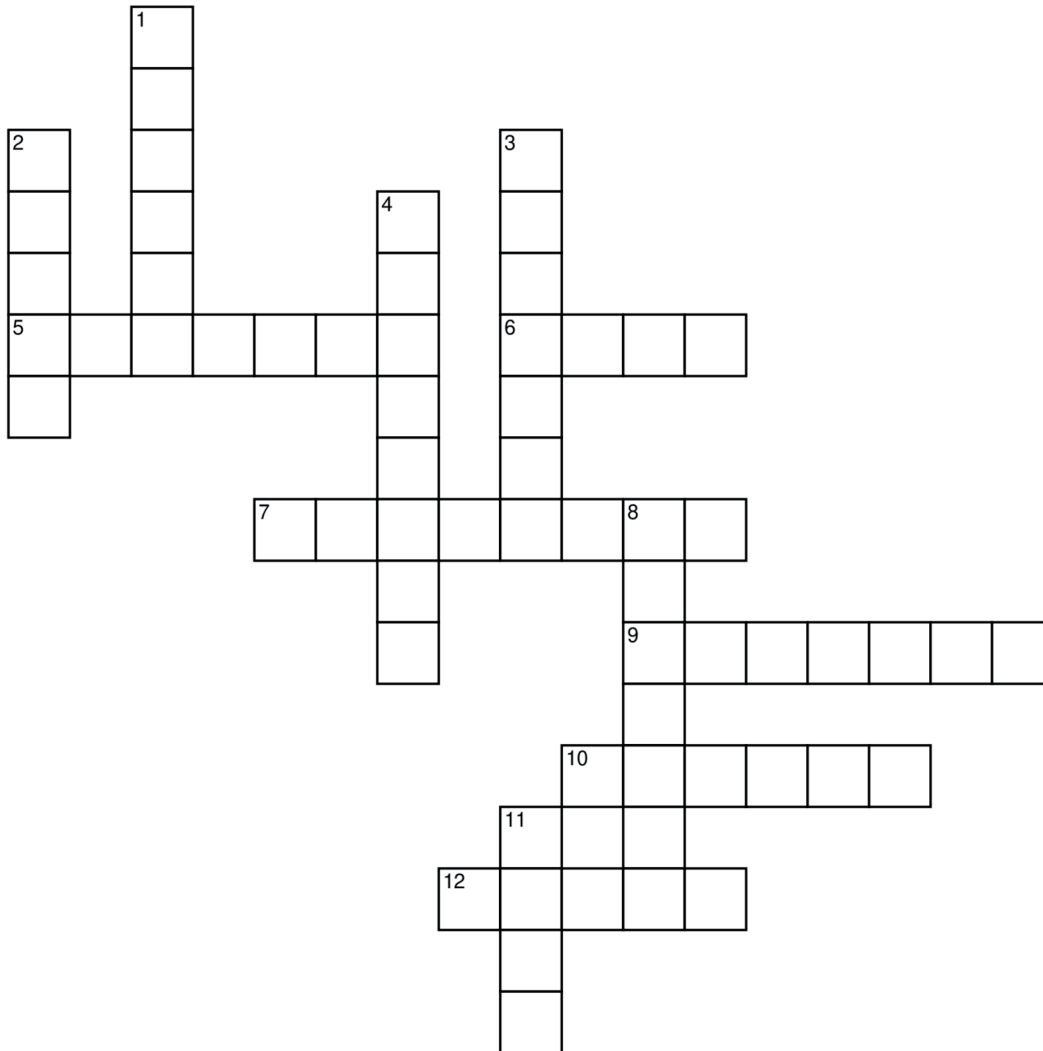

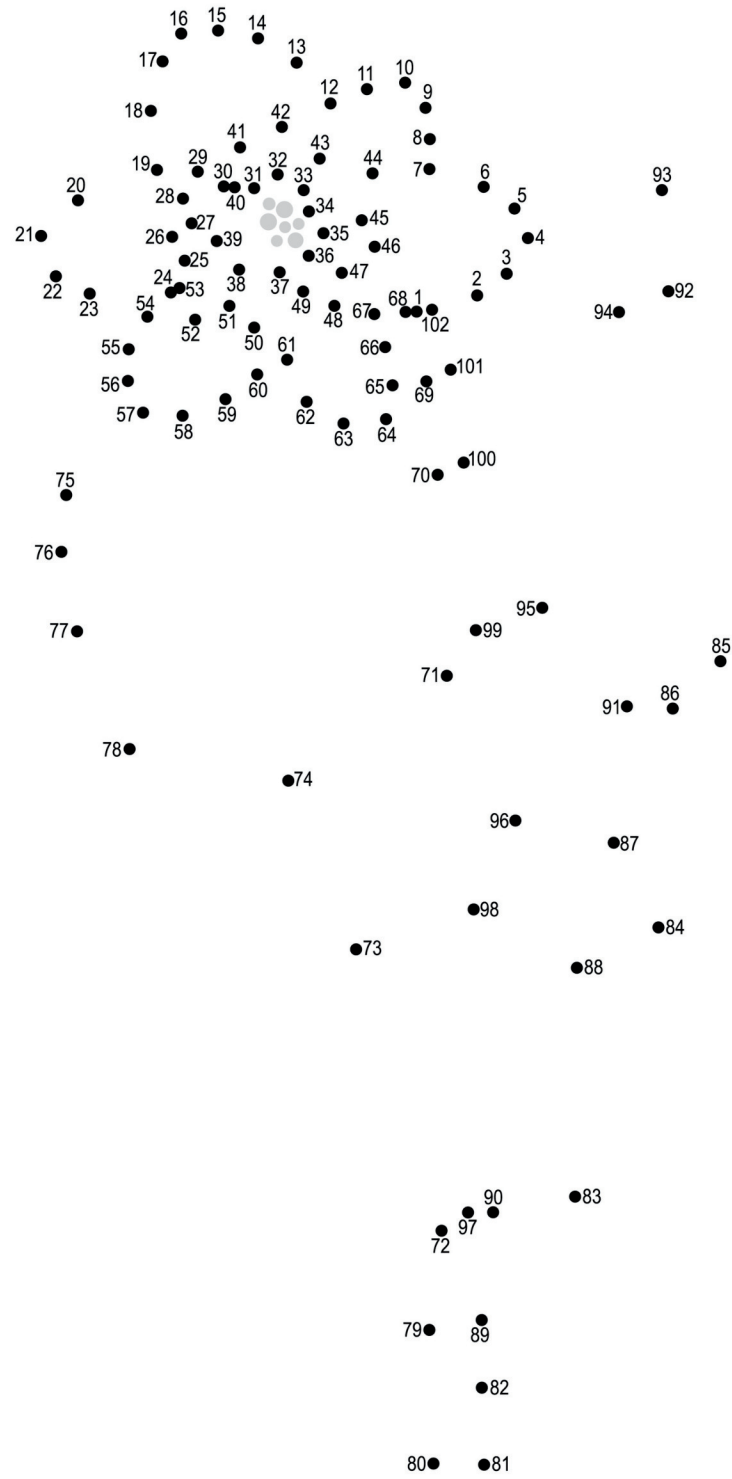
