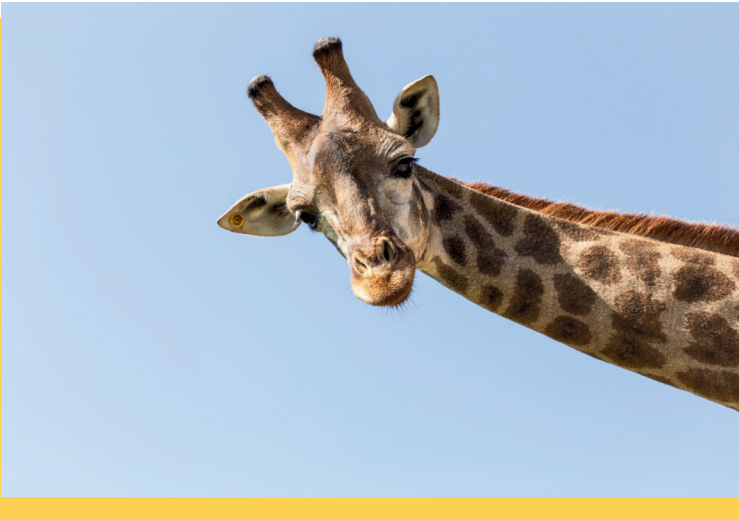


Today in History

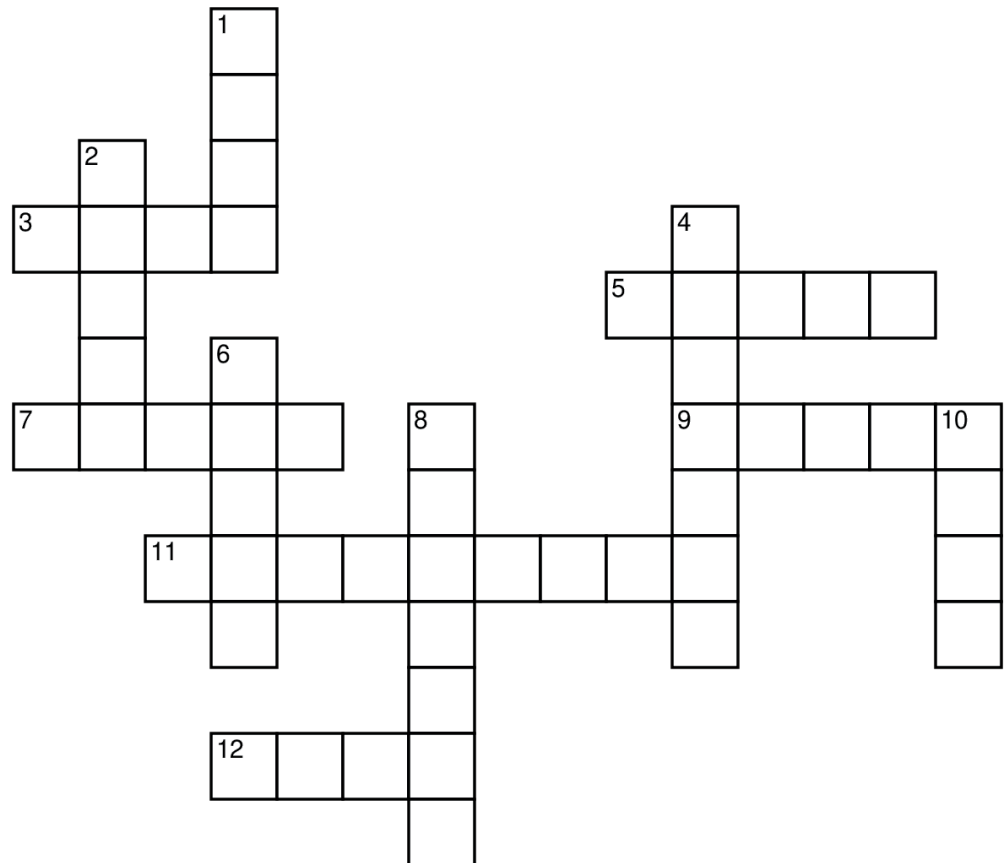
