The First First Lady on Currency

Five U.S. presidents—George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Abraham Lincoln, Andrew Jackson, and Ulysses S. Grant—are featured on current bills. However, Martha Washington is the only First Lady honored in the same way, and the only real woman depicted on U.S. currency. She appeared on a \$1 silver certificate in 1886 and again with George on the back of the \$1 note in 1896. Her design remains notable in U.S. history.

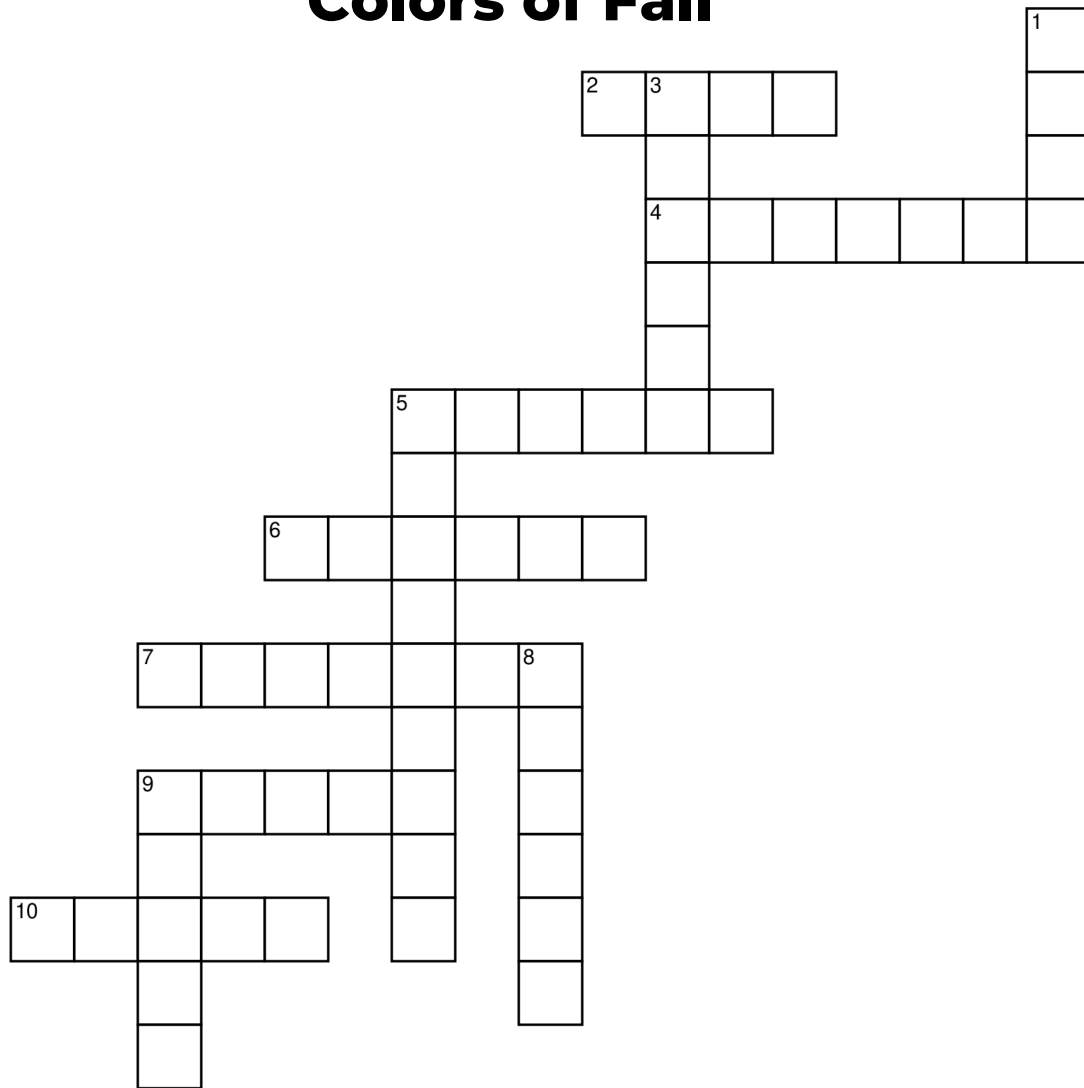

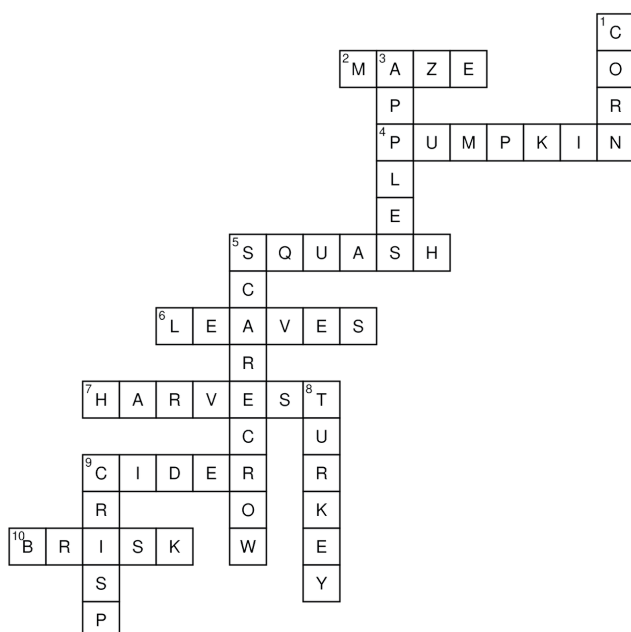
