## National Forget-Me-Not Day

Today's special day is a day to honor and support veterans who have returned from service with injuries and disabilities. This day is to engage people in various activities to show their appreciation for disabled veterans. The tradition began in 1921 by Judge Robert S. Marx as a fundraiser for World War I vets by selling forget-me-not flowers. It highlighted the significant sacrifices they made for our country and emphasized our responsibility to care for them. Marx served during the Meuse-Argonne Offensive. He returned to heal from injuries and to resume the law practice he had before entering the military. Before long, his interest in veterans' affairs became apparent. In 1920, the Disabled American Veterans of the World War was founded, and Judge Marx became the first leader. Today, November 11th, is well established as Veterans' Day or Armistice Day.



## Today in History



In 1857, 20-year-old Paul Morphy won the 1st American Chess Congress, giving him a tournament record of 14 wins, 3 draws, and 1 loss. Morphy retired at age 22 and was known as the "Pride and Sorrow of Chess." He was also acknowledged as the world's greatest chess master.

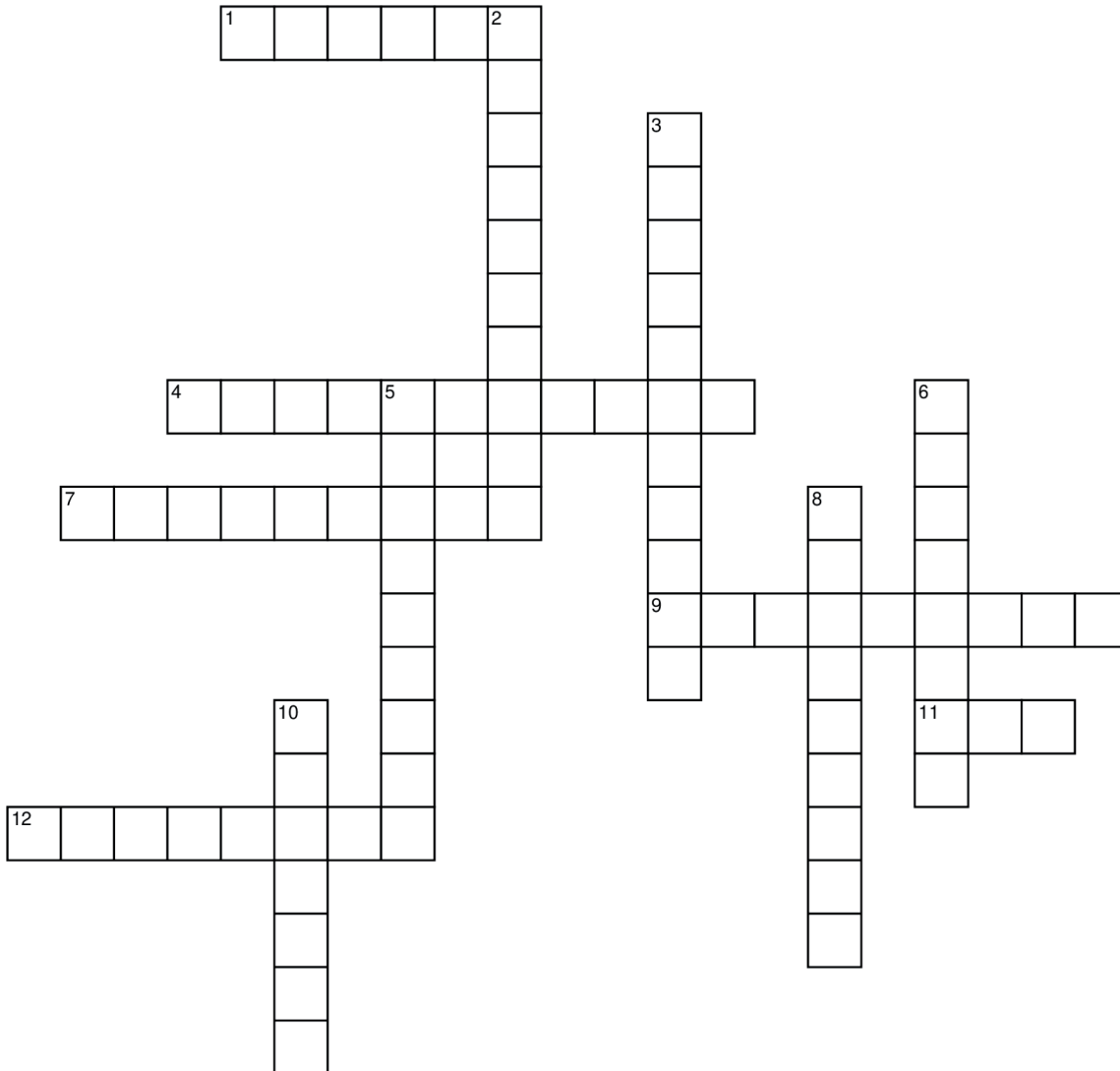

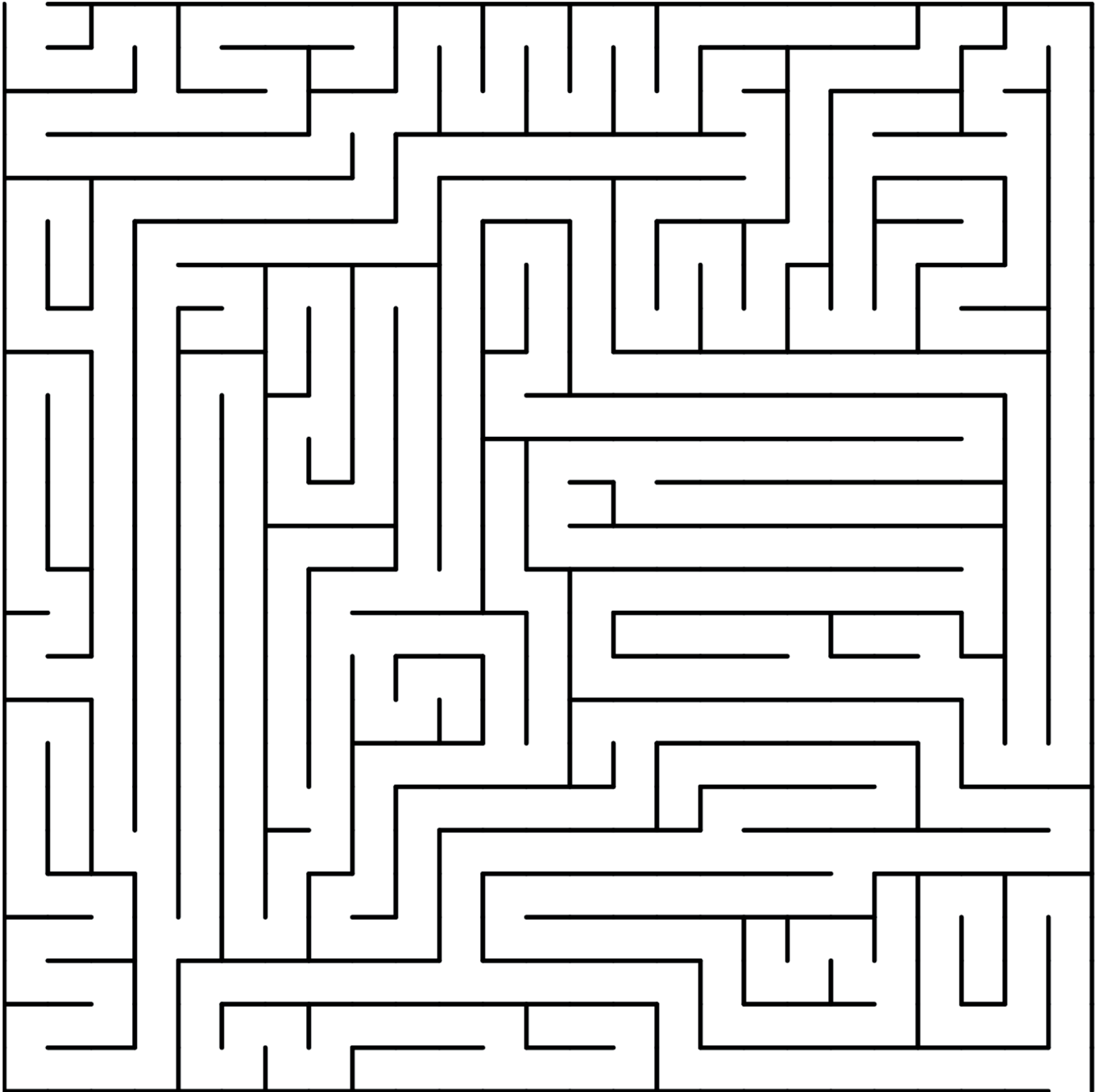
