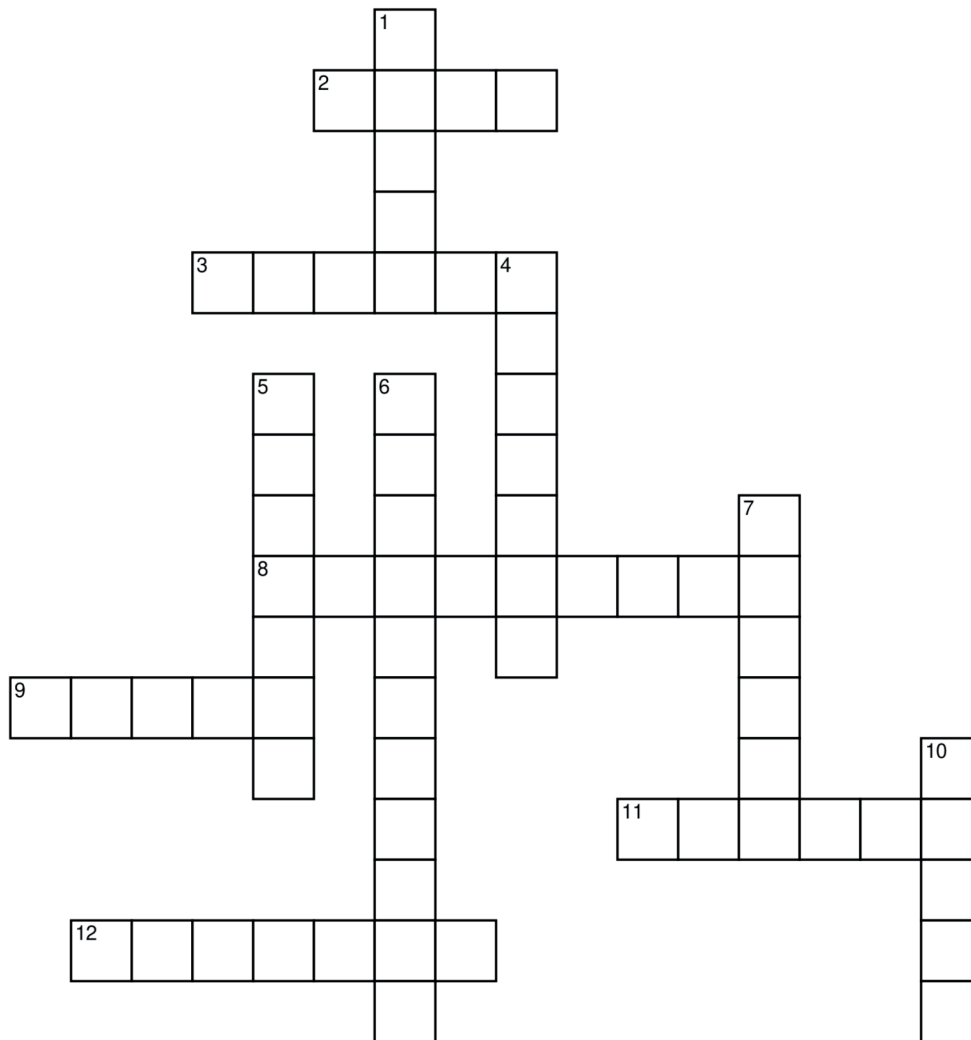
## Helpful Tip:

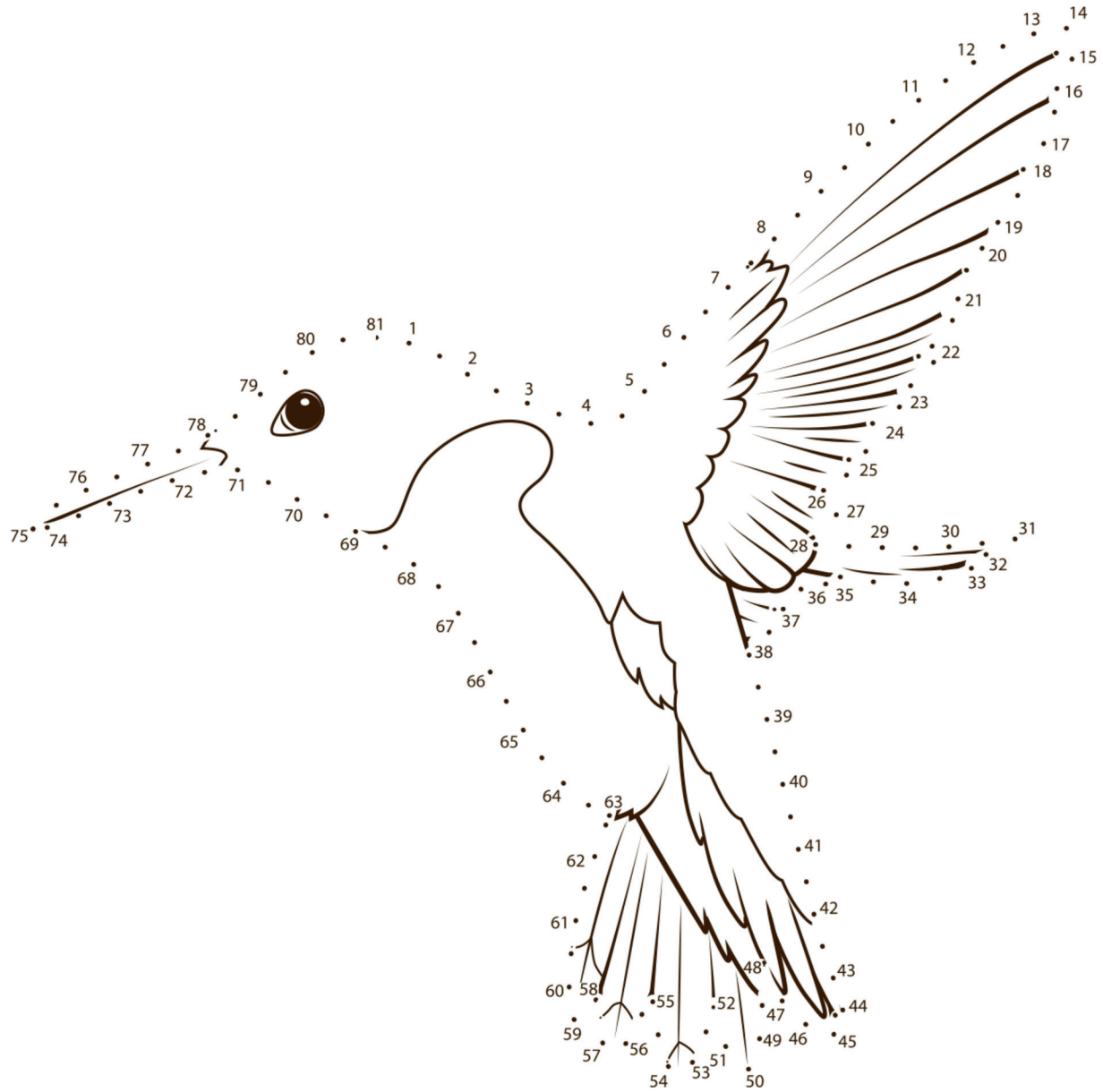
