Did you know the cult band, The Shaggs, was formed because of a prophecy? Austin Wiggins forced his daughters into music after his mother's palm reading predicted they would achieve fame. The sisters had no musical interest or formal training, creating a uniquely discordant sound on their 1969 album, Philosophy of the World. 
