DID YOU KNOW?

Ball, Bell, Boot, and Bone

Did you know McDonald's Chicken McNuggets come in four specific shapes? They aren't random blobs but are precisely formed into the "ball," the "bell," the "boot," and the "bone" (also called the bow-tie). This was done intentionally to ensure consistent cooking times for food safety and to make them more kid-friendly. The standardized shapes also provide a uniform experience for dipping, a key part of what made them an instant hit in the 1980s.

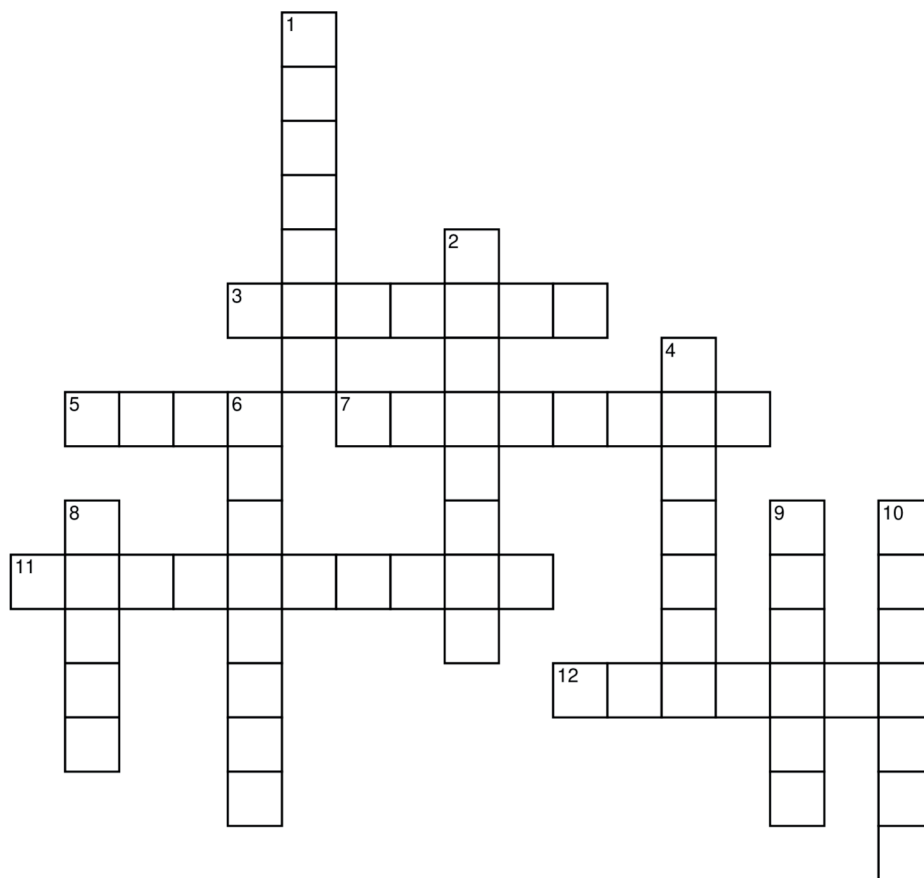

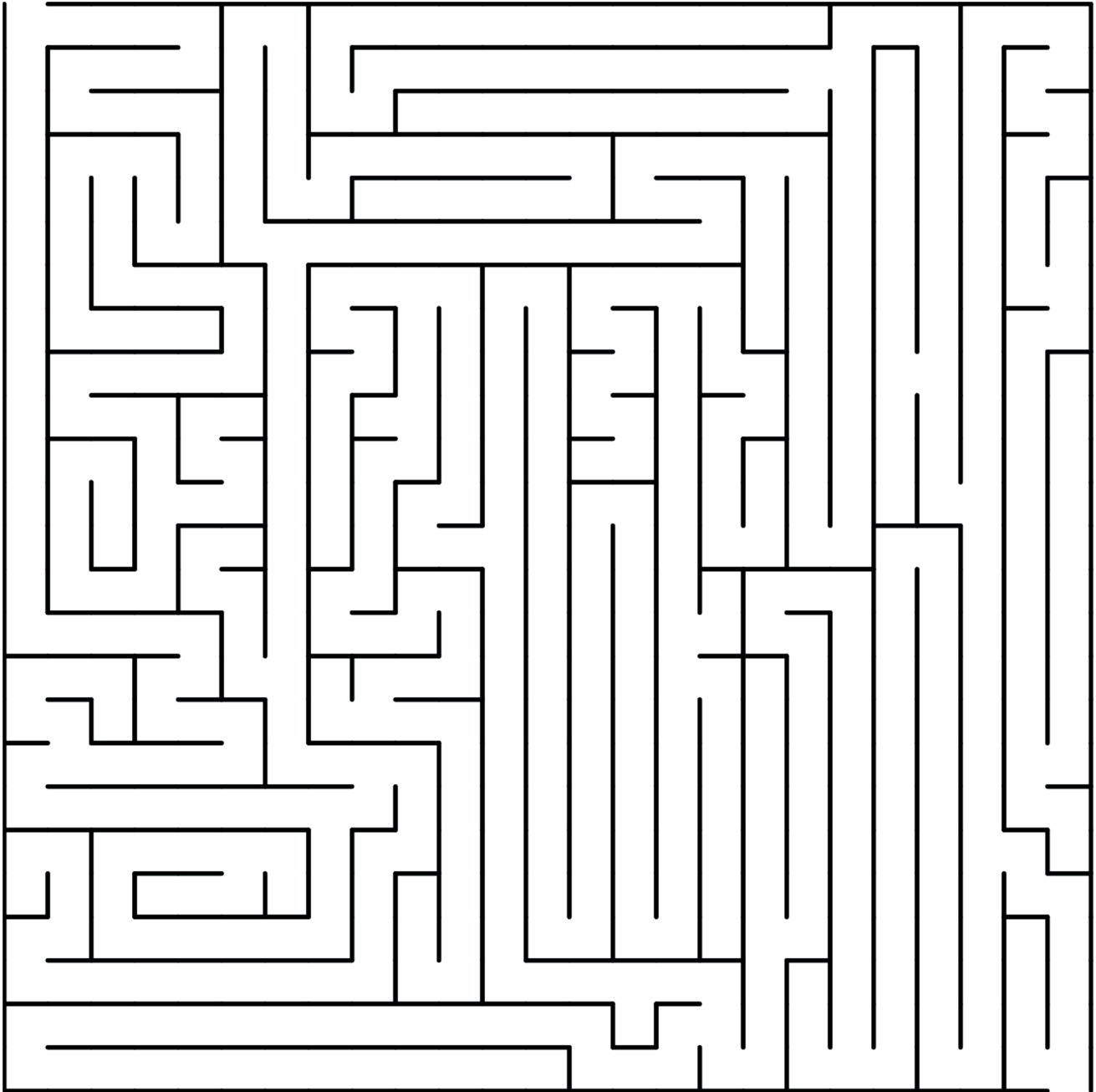

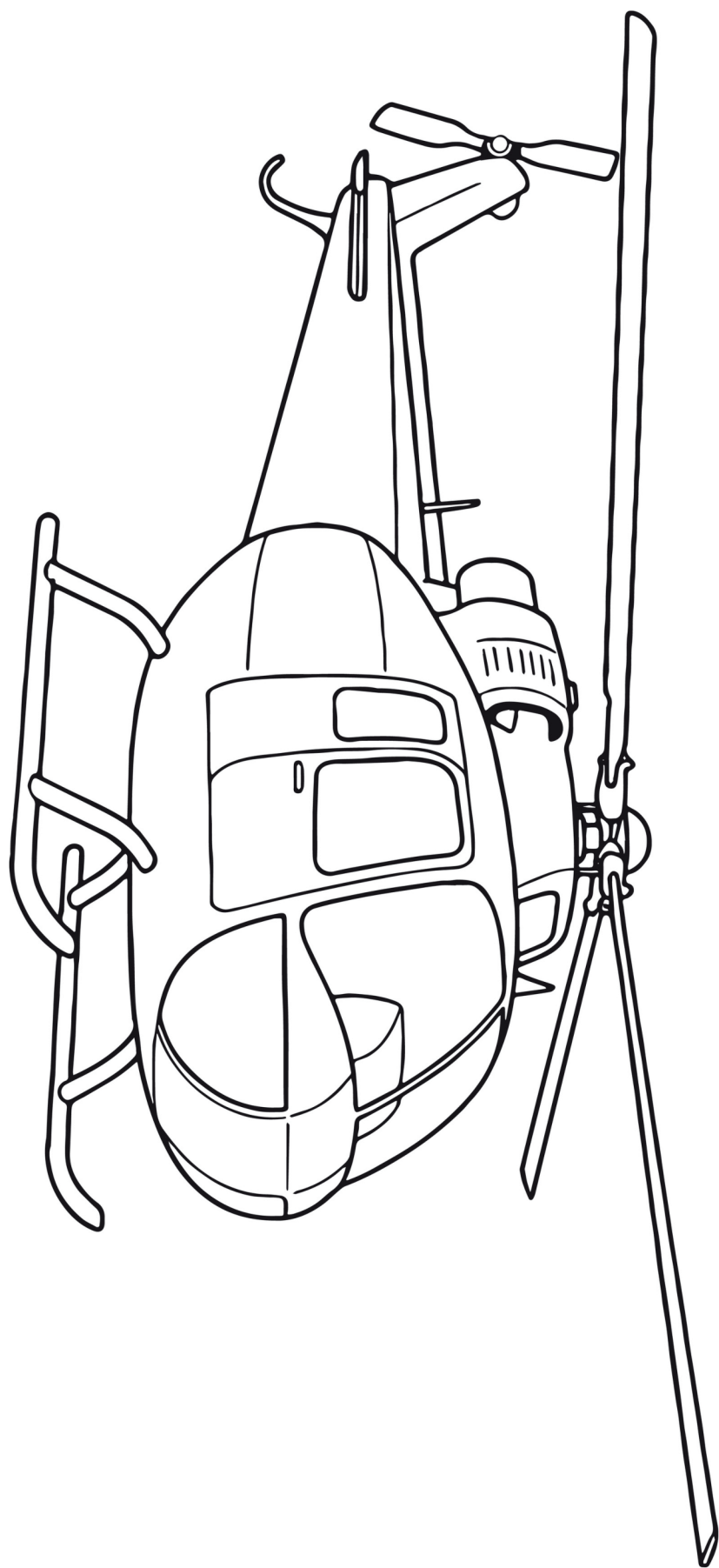
