


Today in History

The Great Misspeller

Did you know that F. Scott Fitzgerald, the celebrated author of *The Great Gatsby* and a master of prose, was a notoriously bad speller? The voice of the Jazz Age consistently struggled with basic orthography, and his personal letters and manuscripts were riddled with errors. It fell to his legendary editor, Maxwell Perkins, to correct the frequent mistakes. This peculiar flaw reveals a surprising gap in the literary genius of one of America's most stylish writers.

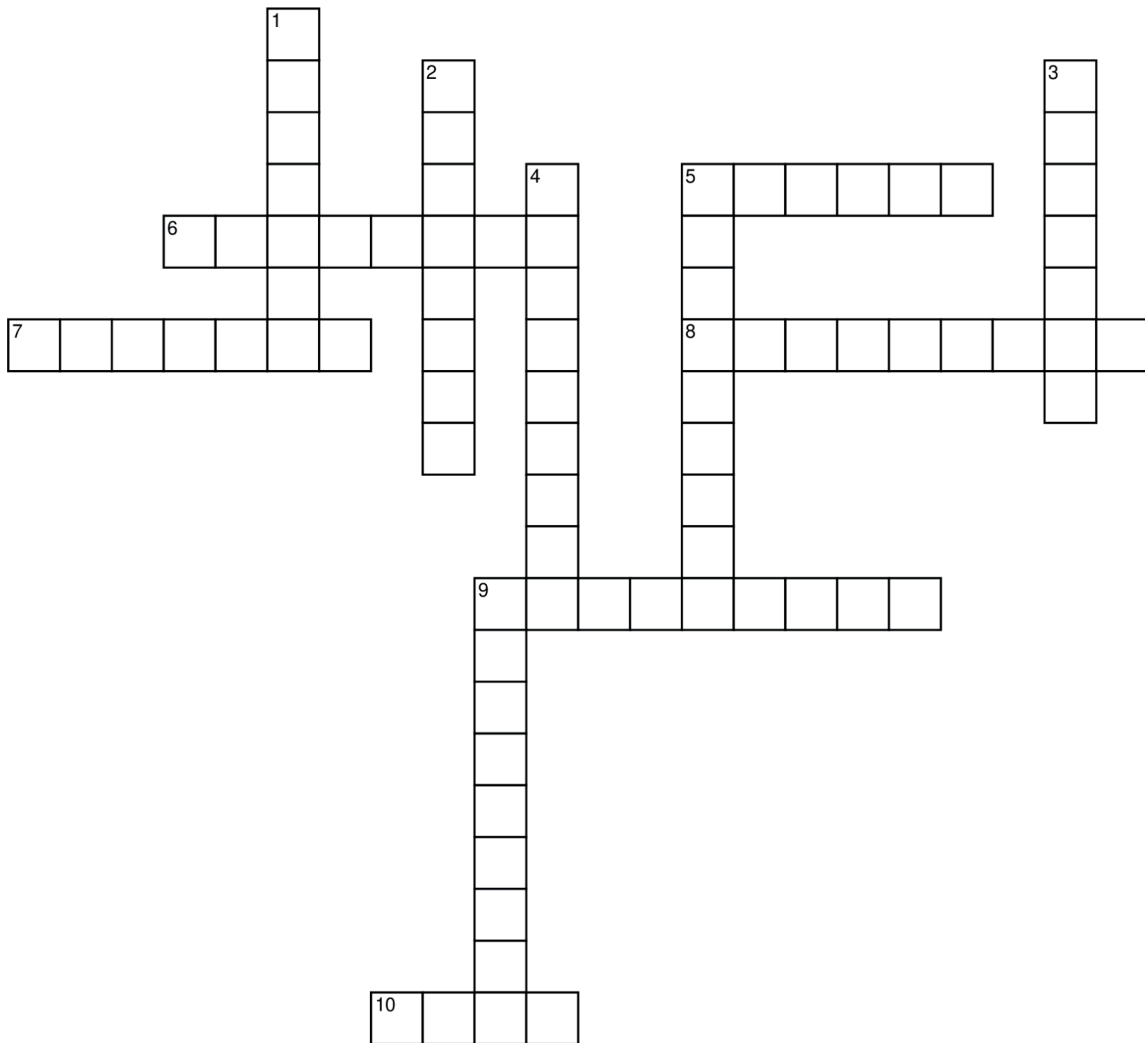

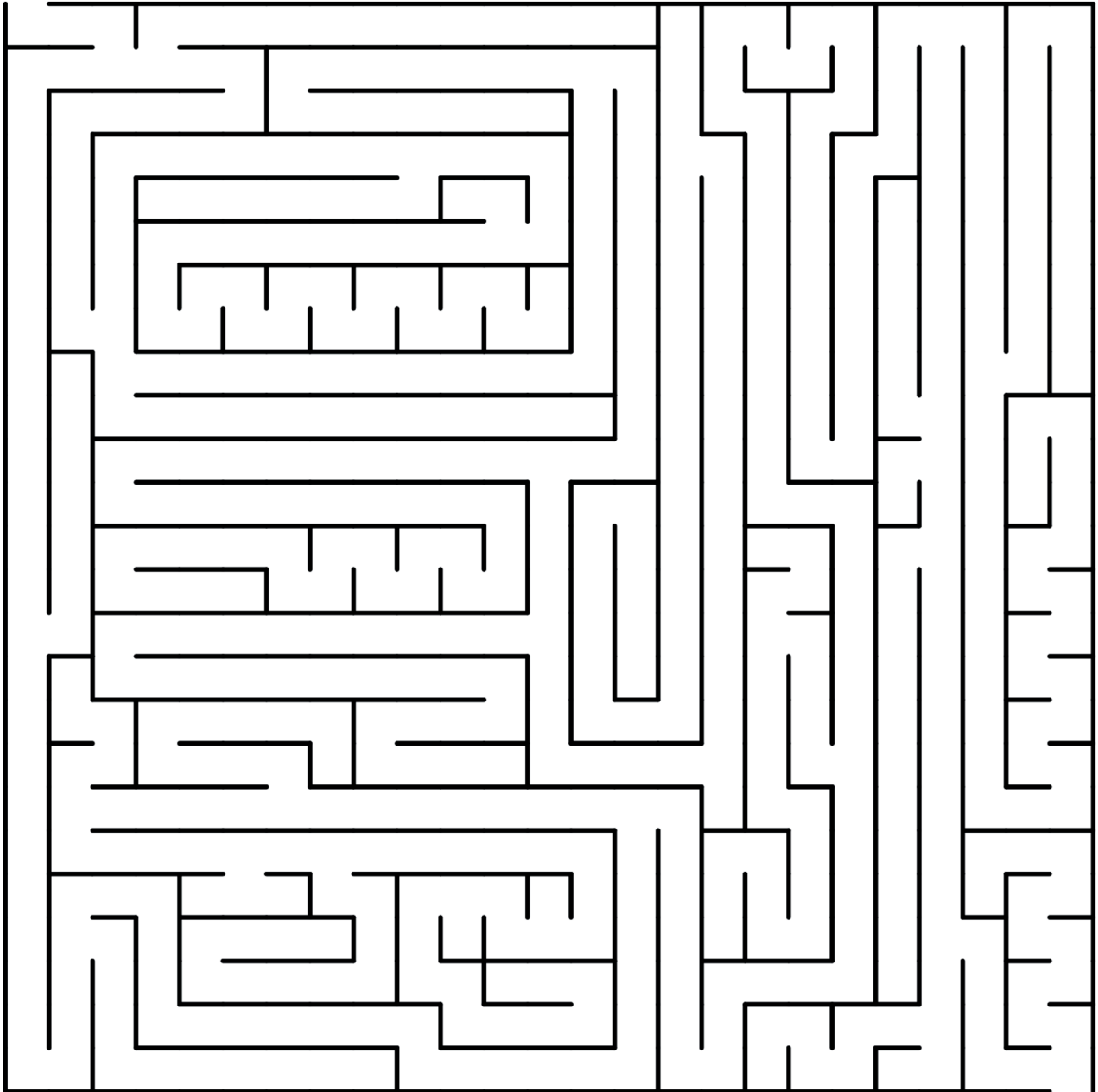
