Did you know that Patsy Cline's iconic 1961 ballad, "Crazy," was written by a young, struggling Willie Nelson? Before he was a music legend, Nelson was working multiple jobs in Houston when he penned the tune. After he moved to Nashville to work as a songwriter, the song was passed to Cline. Her rendition became a massive crossover success, reaching number two on the country charts and becoming a top 10 pop single.

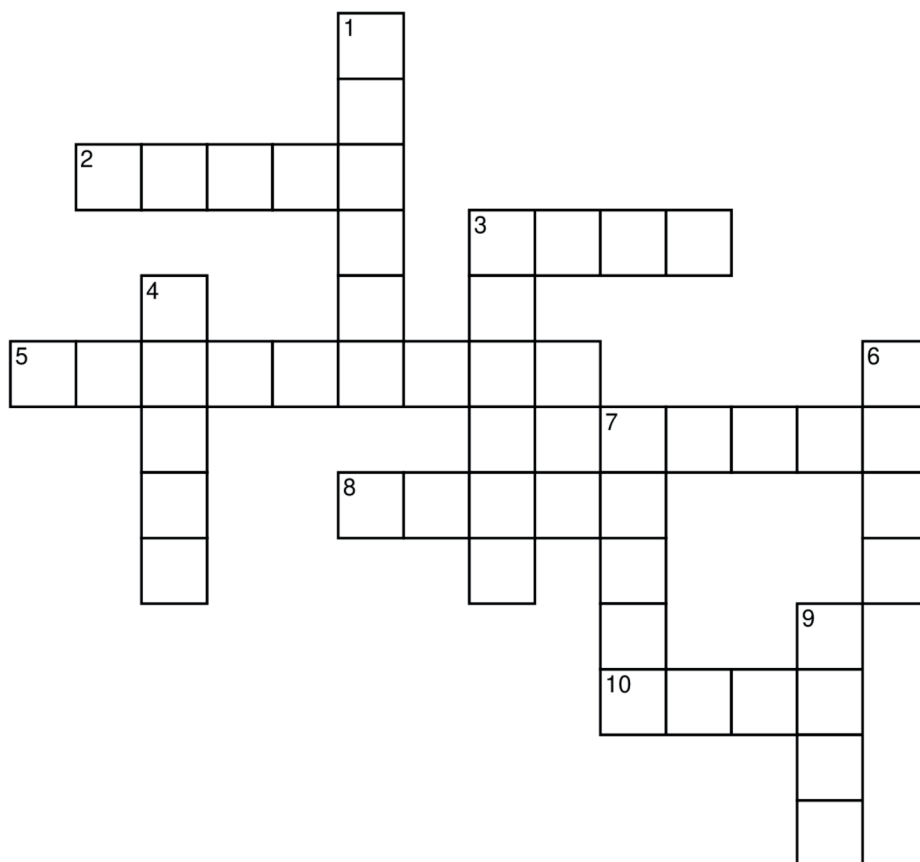

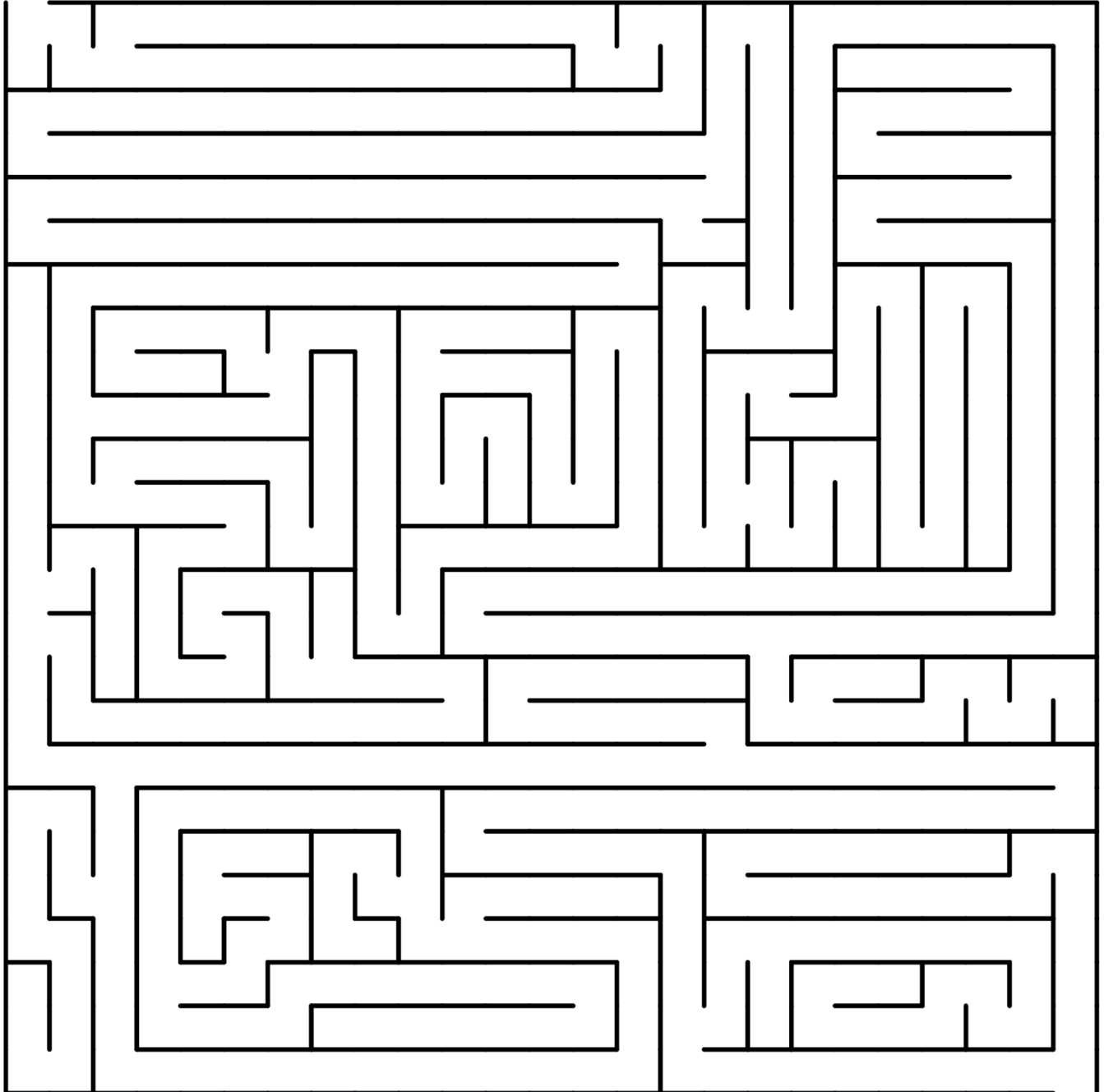

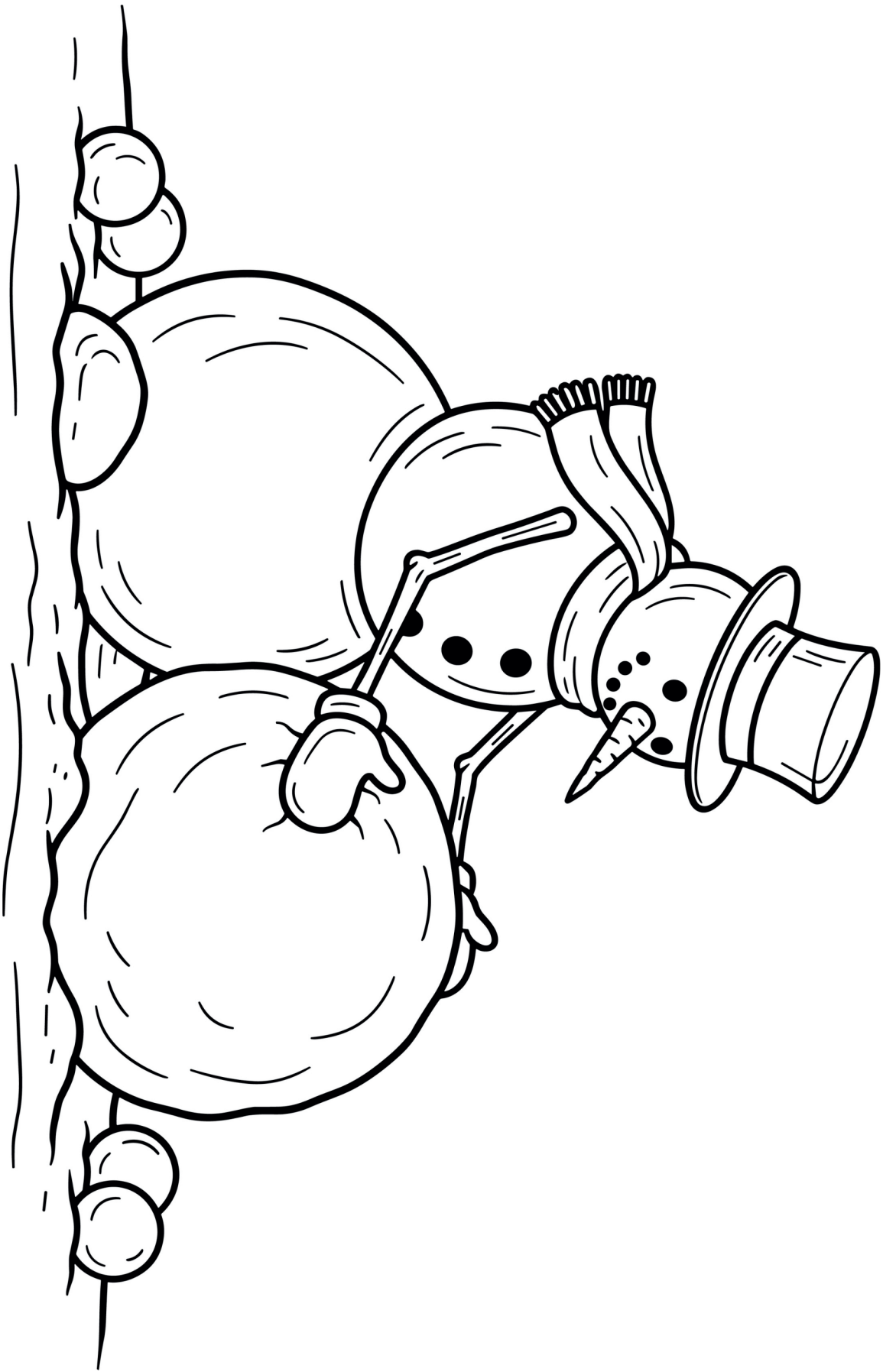
