

Canada's Southern Comfort

Did you know that despite its massive size, 90% of Canada's 40 million residents live within 100 miles of the U.S. border? This extreme population cluster isn't an accident; the vast majority of the country is simply too cold and rugged for large-scale agriculture or settlement. In fact, Canada's three vast northern territories—Yukon, the Northwest Territories, and Nunavut—are home to a combined population of just 128,000 people, leaving the "Great White North" mostly empty.




