Wear Brown Shoes Day

Did you know the term "brown shoe" originated in 1913 when naval aviators in San Diego started wearing brown leather shoes instead of black shoes to hide dust from the dirt airfield? Sailors on ships with lots of coal and tar wore black shoes. Today, aviators still wear brown shoes to distinguish themselves from the rest of the Navy.

Do you have a pair of brown shoes lying around somewhere? If so, while black is the most popular shoe color and white is right behind it, brown often gets overlooked. Brown shoes are earthy and natural to us. Darker shades of brown, like walnut or mahogany, are best for more formal occasions. Brown shoes pair well with earthy tones like khaki, olive, and brown. You can also wear brown dress shoes with gray or navy blue pants. Whatever the occasion, try brown ones today.

DID YOU KNOW? Sergeant Reckless

Did you know that Sergeant Reckless, a heroic horse, became a Marine Corps legend during the Korean War? In a single day, she made 51 solo trips under constant enemy fire to deliver 9,000 pounds of ammunition to the front lines. Wounded twice while shielding soldiers, she was more than livestock; she was family. For her incredible bravery, she was promoted to Sergeant, awarded two Purple Hearts, and eventually buried with full military honors, a hero recognized for her strength and heart.

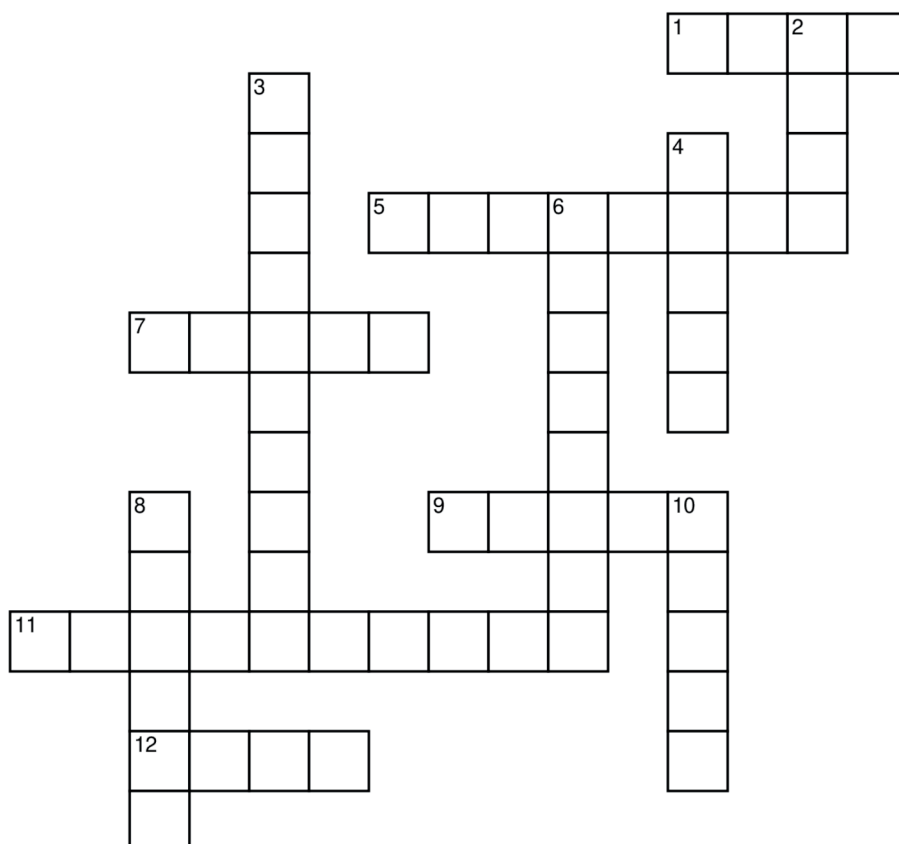

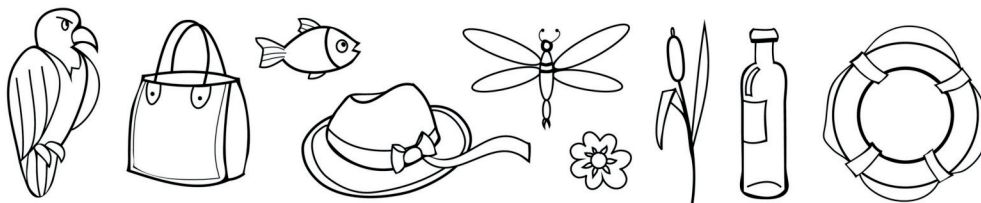

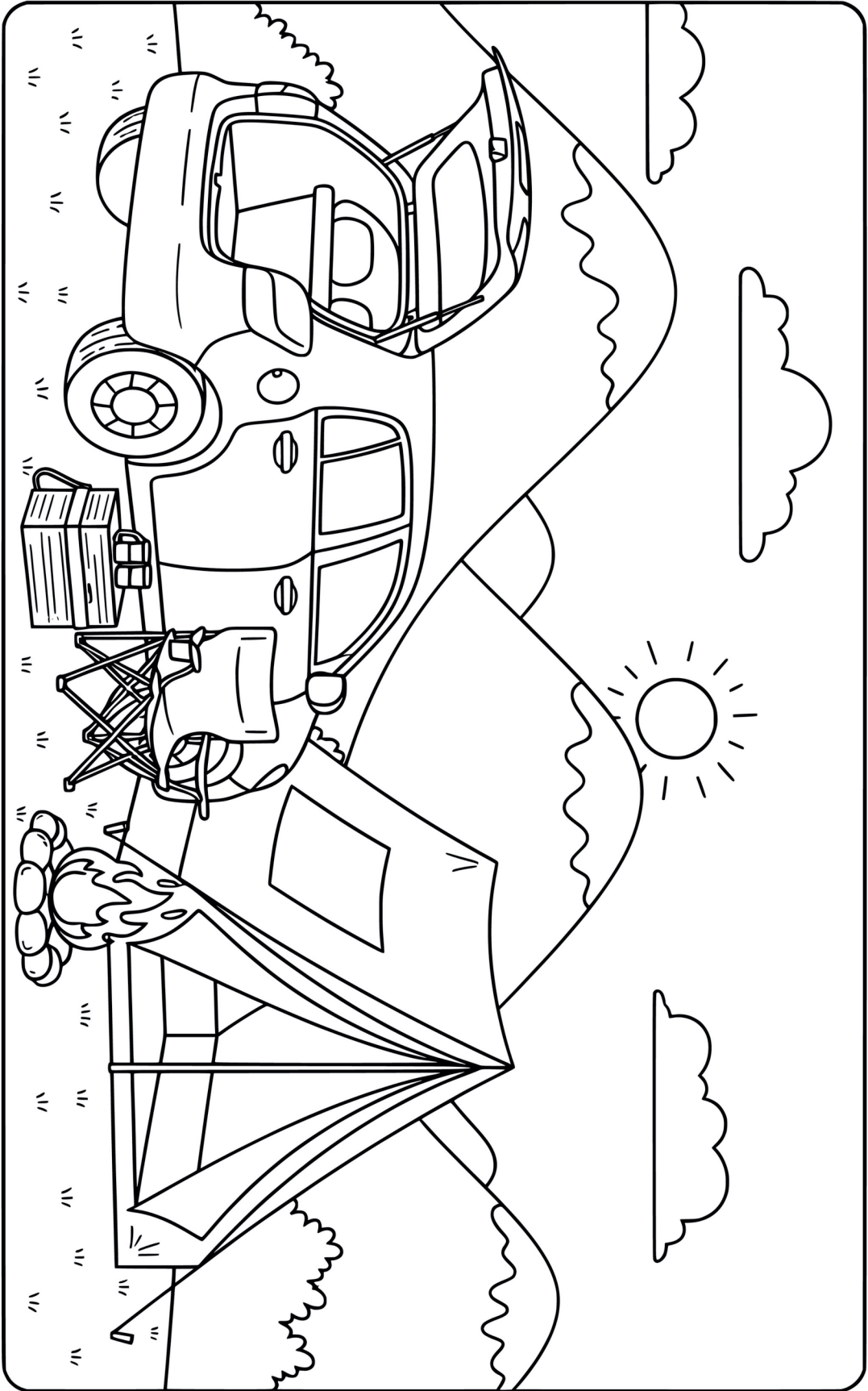
