

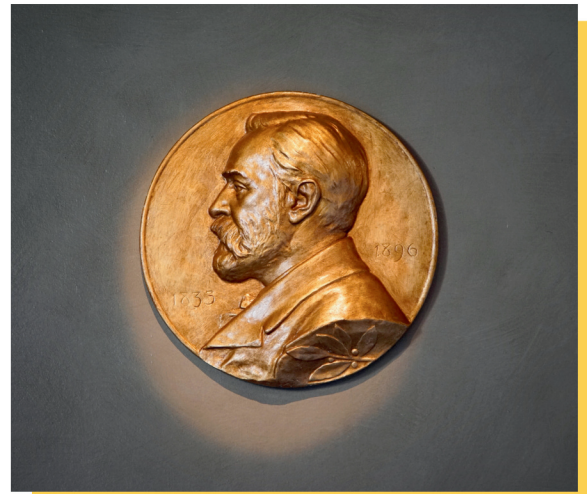

## Nobel Prize Day

Nobel Prize Day is celebrated in honor of Alfred Nobel, who died on this day in 1895. It was Nobel's final wish to establish several categories of prizes for accomplishments made in academic, cultural, and scientific advances that served the betterment of mankind. Several years later, in 1901, his wish was granted as the first Nobel Prizes were awarded. Since then, the Nobel Prize Foundation has presented awards each year to those who excel in physics, chemistry, physiology, medicine, literature, and economic sciences.

The most important one, however, is the Nobel Peace Prize, which is awarded to "those who did their best for mankind." Take some time today to see who was awarded Nobel prizes this year!



## Today in History



In 1931, Jane Addams became the first woman Nobel laureate when she was the co-recipient of the Nobel Peace Prize. Addams was a social reformer and activist who co-founded one of America's first settlement houses, the Hull House of Chicago, which provided services for the poor.

### **The Tiniest Show on Earth**

Did you know that for decades, the lives of thousands of premature babies were saved not in hospitals, but in sideshows at amusement parks like Coney Island? Martin Couney, a pioneer of incubator technology, championed the care of these infants when mainstream medicine offered little hope. He funded their expensive treatment by charging the public 25 cents to view the tiny babies in his "Infantorium," a practice that, while unorthodox, is credited with saving over 6,500 lives.

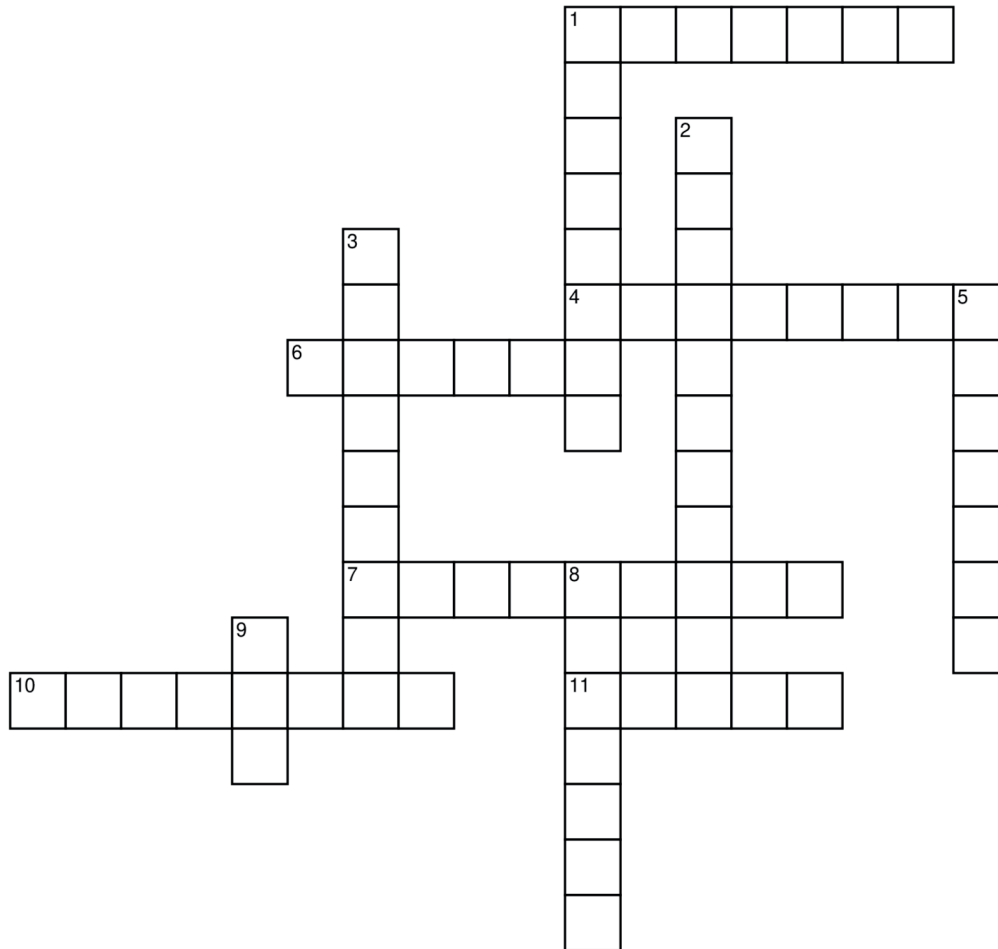

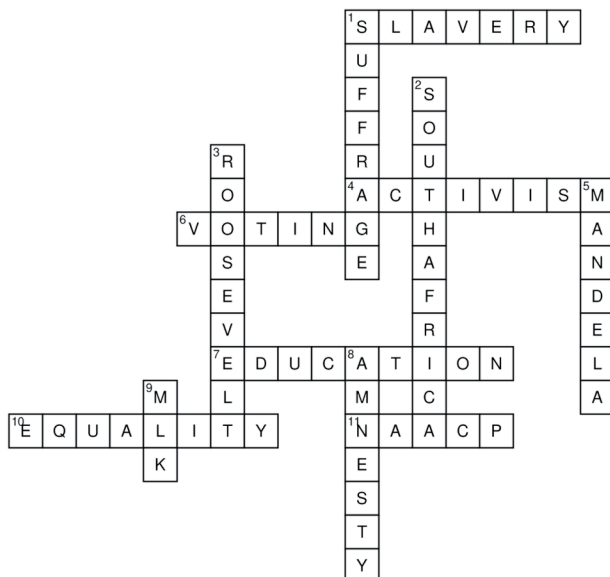
