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DID YOU KNOW?

Antiseptic Meets All-Purpose Cleaner

Listerine was initially developed as a surgical antiseptic but was later marketed as a floor cleaner and a cure for other illnesses to expand its sales. In the 1920s, the company sought to reach a broader audience and rebranded Listerine as a remedy for "chronic halitosis," commonly known as bad breath. This strategy proved to be a huge success, leading to a significant increase in revenue, surpassing \$8 million within seven years.




