### From Critique to Praise: The Journey of "David"

In 1504, Michelangelo's "David" faced criticism for its nose from Pier Soderini, a Florentine patron. To avoid changing his masterpiece, Michelangelo pretended to make adjustments while secretly dropping marble dust and small fragments. Spectators believed the nose had been modified, leading Soderini to declare the statue perfect after the "change." "David" remains a symbol of Florence and a testament to Michelangelo's genius, needing no artistic advice.


