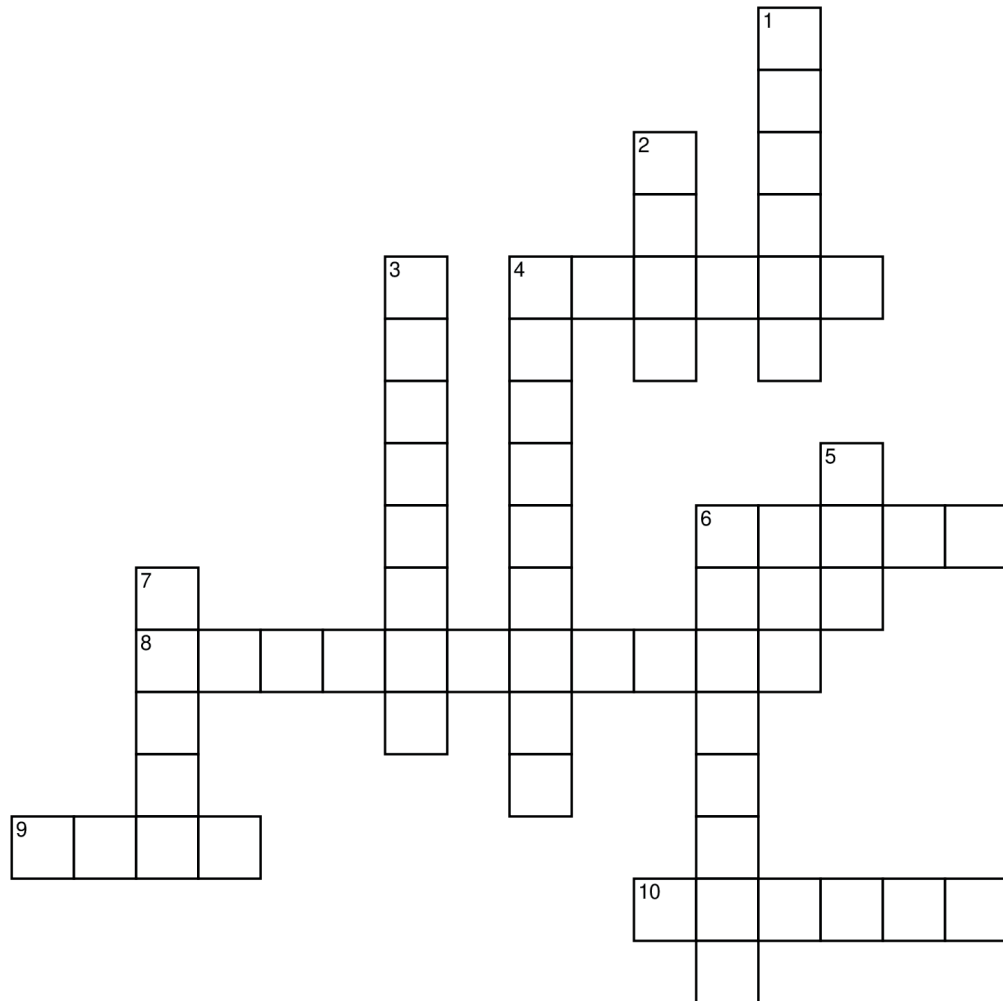

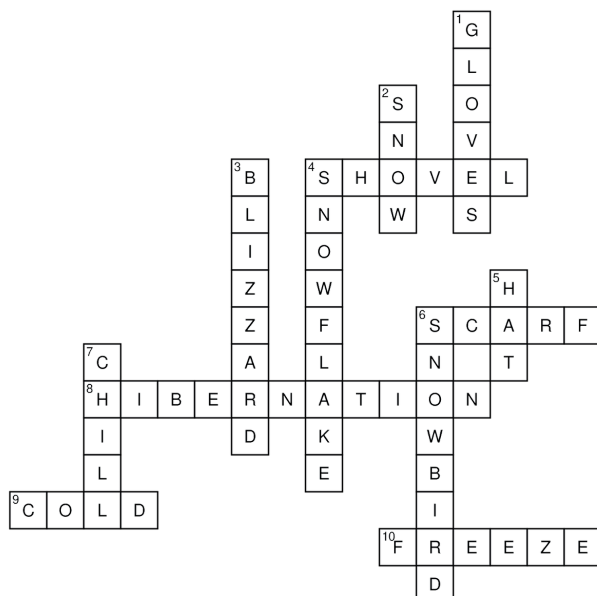
Trivia Answer: A.
