



A Walk Down Abbey Road

Abbey Road, arguably the most famous album cover, features all four Beatles walking across the street in front of EMI Recording Studios. Taken by Iain Macmillan on August 8, 1969, the iconic photo was shot in just 15 minutes with police assistance to stop traffic.

Interestingly, the album wasn't originally titled Abbey Road, and it's the only Beatles album cover without their name. Designer John Kosh believed it wasn't necessary since they were already the most famous band in the world.






SOLUTIONS
