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DID YOU KNOW? Love's Little Tokens

Throughout history, people have used trinkets, like jewelry and coins, to express love. In the Victorian era, love tokens—engraved coins—became popular, particularly in the U.S. and Great Britain. This tradition may have roots in the French custom of treize. Love tokens peaked during the Civil War when soldiers created them for loved ones. By the early 20th century, their popularity waned in favor of locket, though they still emerged during the world wars.

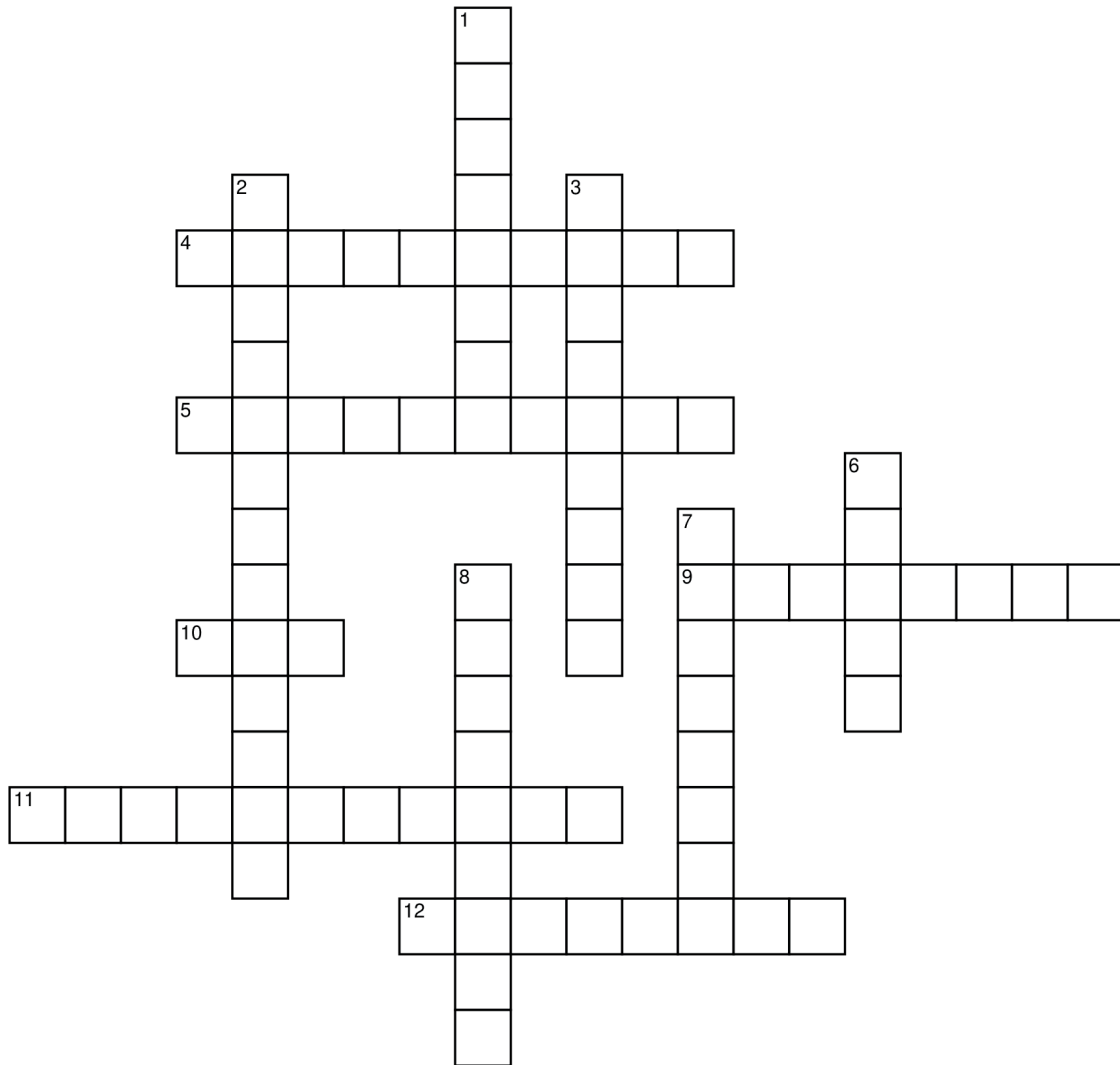

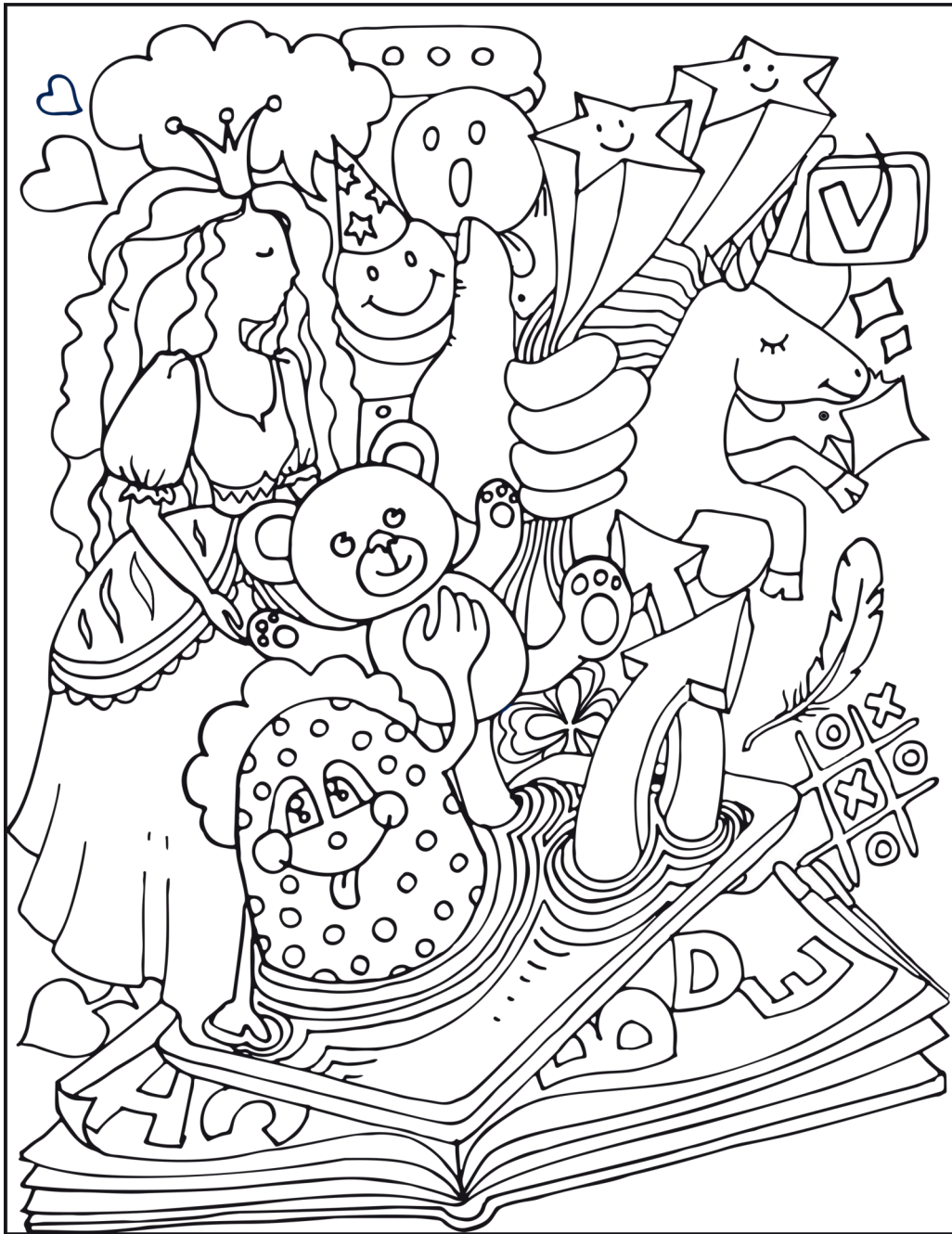
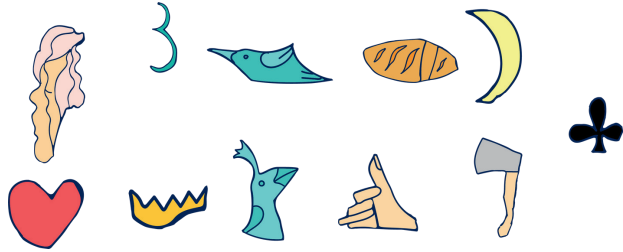
