Radio, Records, and Rookies

Introduced in 1921, Wheaties struggled until General Mills sponsored baseball broadcasts and the radio series Jack Armstrong, the All-American Boy. Listeners were encouraged to eat like Jack, birthing the iconic slogan "The Breakfast of Champions." In 1934, Yankees first baseman Lou Gehrig became the first athlete featured on the box. This move turned a simple cereal into a cultural milestone that top athletes still follow today.




Use the following conversation prompts to start a discussion with friends or family! You may also use the provided lines to answer the questions on your own if you prefer.
