## DID YOU KNOW? Peace Symbol

Gerald Holtom created the iconic peace sign in 1958 for the British Campaign for Nuclear Disarmament. The design combines the semaphore signals for "N" and "D"—standing for nuclear disarmament—inside a circle. Beyond the letters, Holtom intended the symbol to represent despair, with the internal lines mimicking a person with hands outstretched downward against the earth. Today, it remains a universal emblem of hope and protest.




## Trivia Answer: D
