In 1880, James "Jumper" Wide, a railway worker, used a baboon named Jack to help him after losing his legs in an accident. Jack was trained to push the wheelchair and operate signals. The railway officially employed Jack, paying him twenty cents a day and half a bottle of beer weekly. Jack worked without mistakes for nine years until his death from tuberculosis in 1890. His skull is now in the Albany Museum.


