National Pig in a Blanket Day

Pigs in a Blanket is a simple concept with a history in many cultures. We may not know exactly who first wrapped a sausage in dough, but in America, some credit the recipe to Betty Crocker, who included a version in a 1957 cookbook. This helped make it a well-known American dish.

In Mexico, these delightful little snacks are known as salchitacos—sausages wrapped in tortillas, resembling the universally recognizable taco. In China, a similar dish features meat wrapped in steamed pastry or cabbage leaves, called Lap Cheong Bao. The Finnish version, nakkipiilo, translates to "hidden sausage." Pigs in a Blanket Day is the perfect opportunity to celebrate all of these delectable variations.

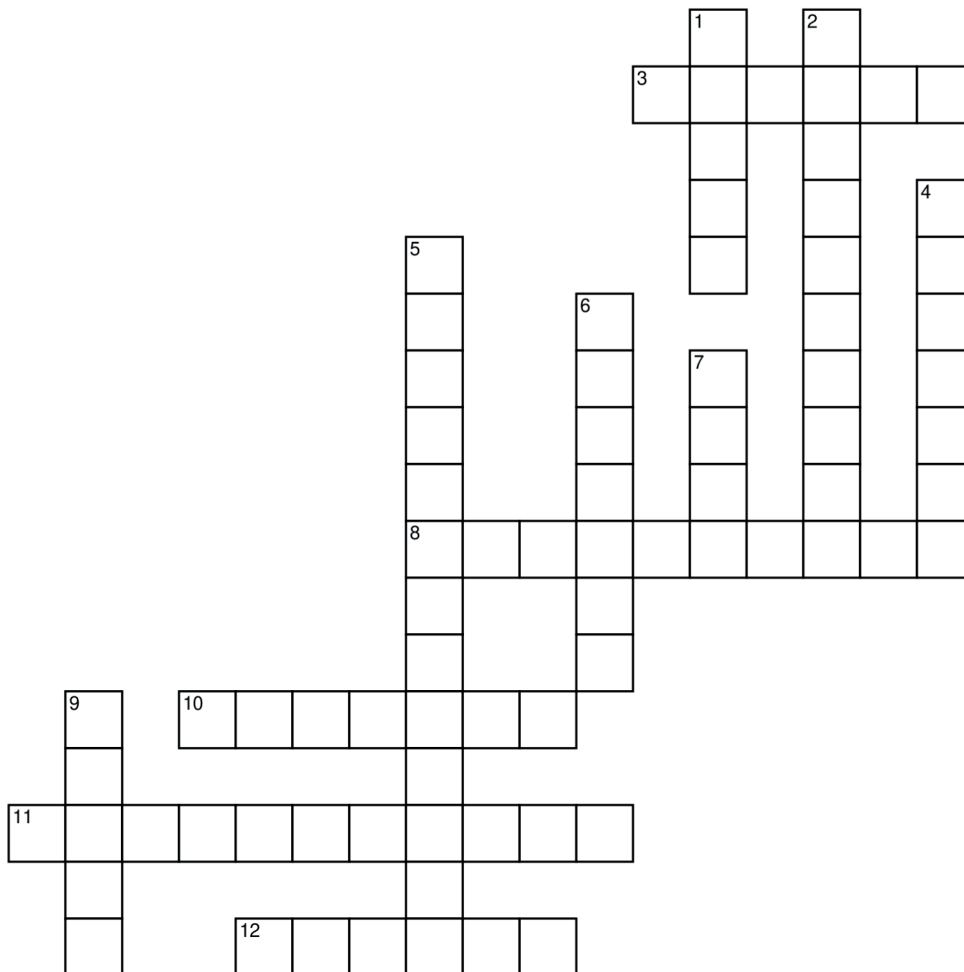

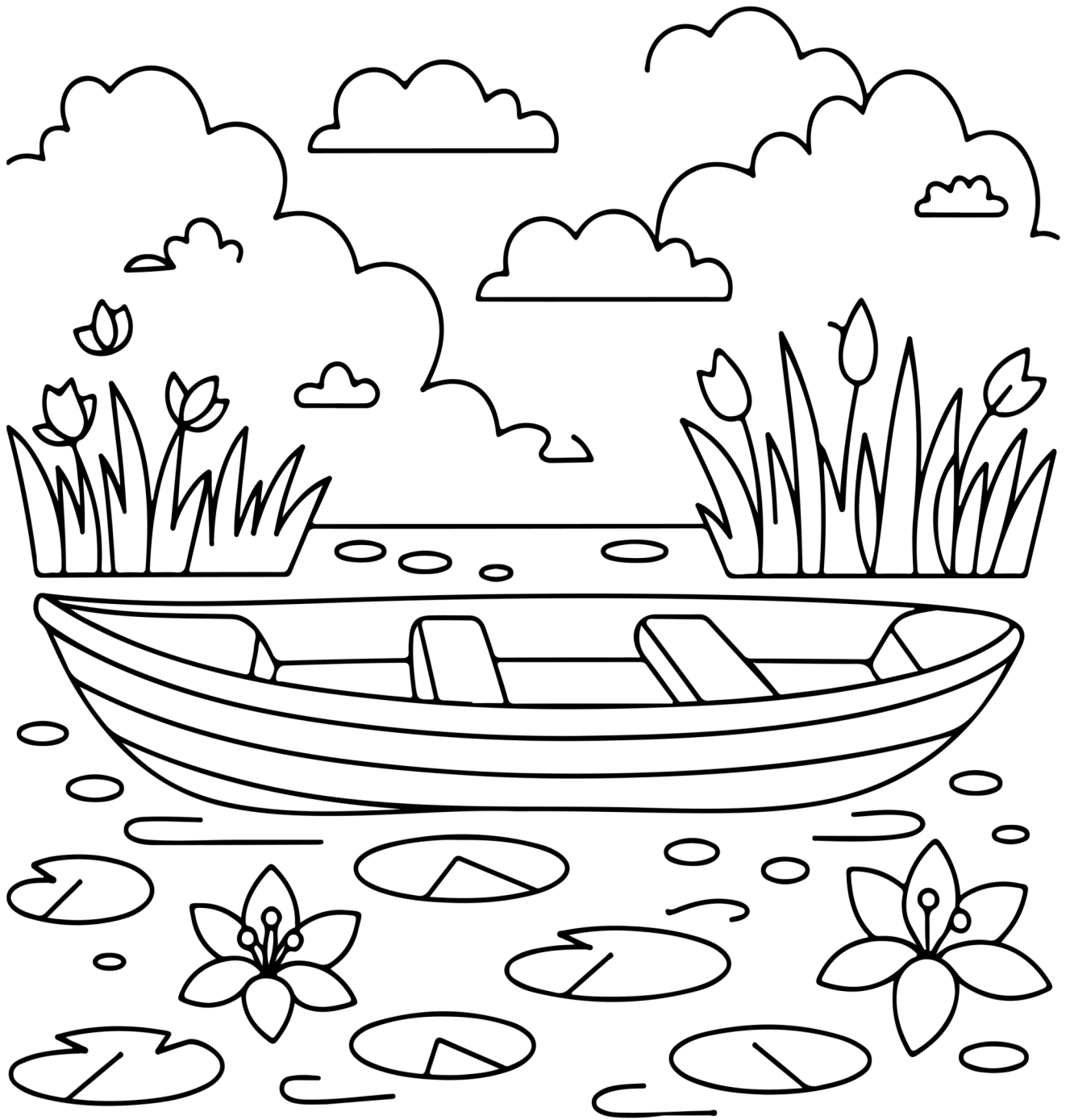

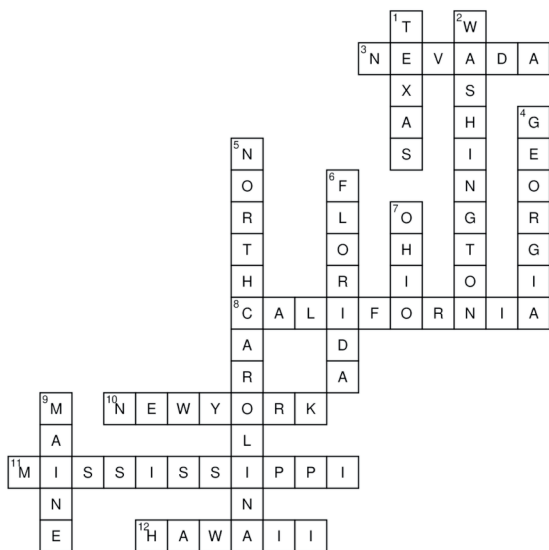
