National Tartan Day

This day is named after the woolen fabric known as tartan, which is a traditional Scottish fabric consisting of squares and crisscrossing lines, and is commonly seen in kilts. This day commemorates the signing of the Scottish Declaration of Independence in 1320, which is significant because the American Declaration of Independence was modeled after it. It is worth noting that many of the Founding Fathers of the United States were of Scottish descent. In fact, almost half of the signers of the Declaration of Independence and nine of the 13 governors of the newly formed United States were Scottish. Tartan Day was first celebrated in Canada in the mid-1980s and was later adopted by Scottish Americans in the United States in 1998. To celebrate, you can attend a parade, wear a kilt and sporran, or cook and enjoy a traditional Scottish dish.

In 1947, the first Tony Awards were handed out at a ceremony held in the Grand Ballroom of the Waldorf Astoria Hotel. Winners included Arthur Miller and Patricia Neal. The Tonys were named after actress, director, and producer Antoinette Perry.

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DID YOU KNOW?

A Blizzard in Iran!

In 1972, Iran experienced a drought that lasted for 1,460 days. When moisture finally did begin to fall, it came as snow rather than rain. The blizzard lasted for an entire week and resulted in snow 10-26 feet deep. The region was about the size of Wisconsin and encompassed much of western Iran. The area was buried for more than a week.

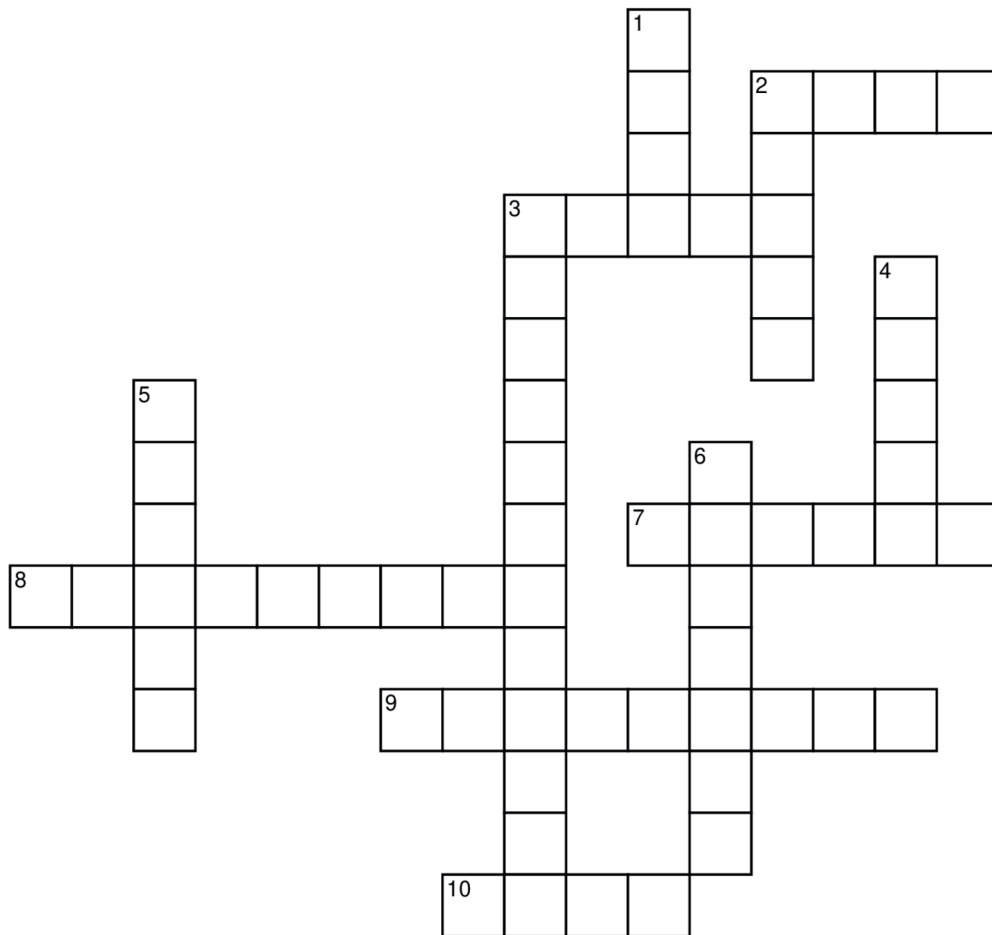
