National Telephone Day

The telephone has become an essential part of our lives. Without the phone, it would be much harder to stay in touch with our loved ones and seek the help we might require. If Bell's lawyer had not been present when he filed for a patent on his phone, someone else might have been credited as the phone's inventor. Bell's lawyer hurried to the U.S. Patent Office in Boston on February 14, 1876, to file the telephone patent. Elisha Gray filed a notice of intent to apply for a patent later that day. On March 7, 1876, the patent office granted Bell the patent because he had filed his record first. Later that year, Bell demonstrated his device at the World's Fair in Philadelphia, and the White House installed its first phone a year later. The revolution of the telephone had begun!



Today in History



In 1914, when World War I began, President Woodrow Wilson was persuaded by Argentina, Brazil, and Chile to accept mediation in the conflict in Mexico. He became the first Democrat since Andrew Jackson to be re-elected to consecutive terms in 1916.

Dolly Parton, a country music legend, holds numerous records, including 26 Number 1 hits and 42 Top 10 albums. She has 110 charted singles and 25 certified Gold, Platinum, or Multiplatinum albums. Parton holds Guinness World Records for Most Decades with a Top-20 Hit and Most Hits on the US Country Songs Charts by a Female Artist. She received two Academy Award nominations and won a Grammy in 2020 for a duet with For King & Country.

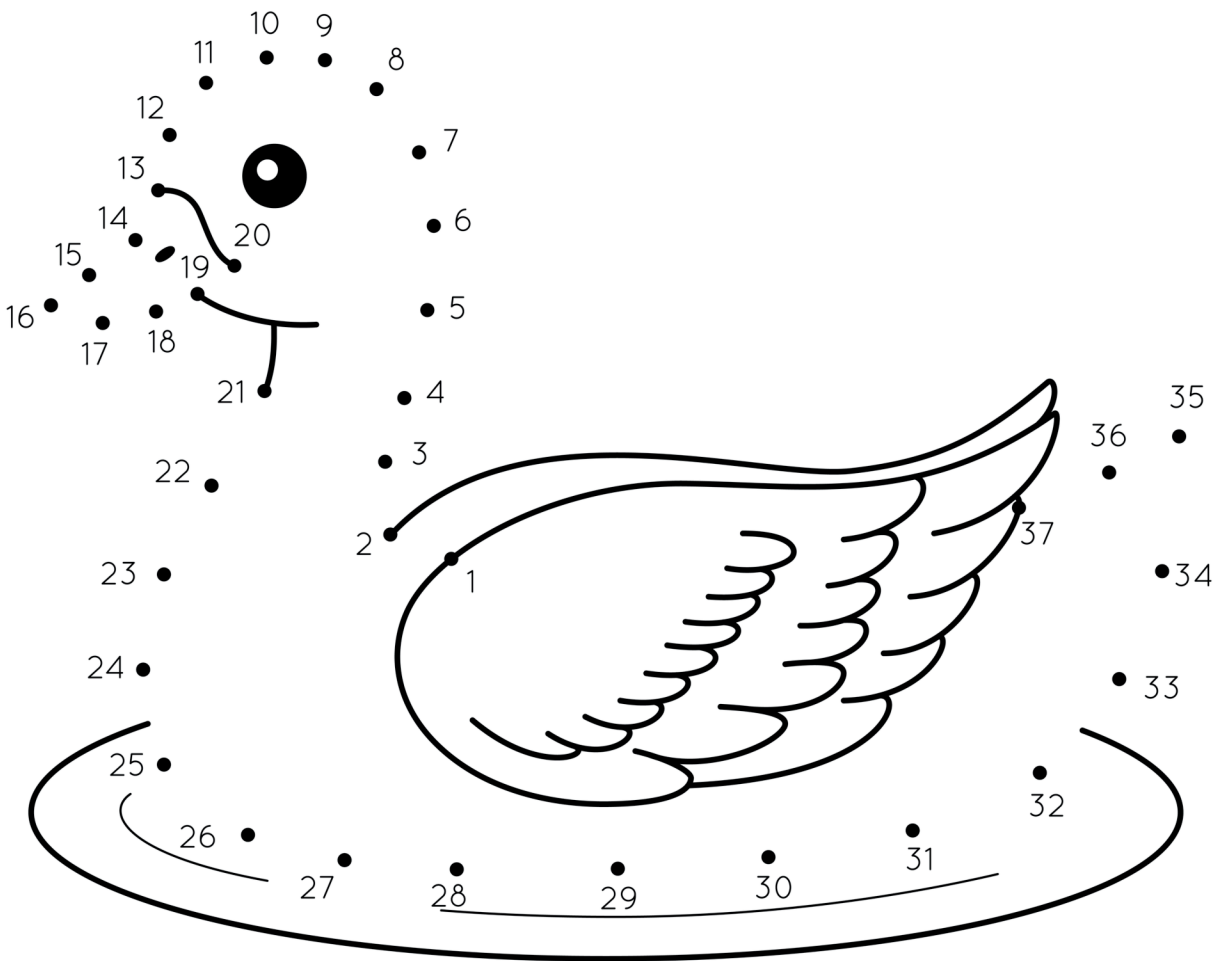

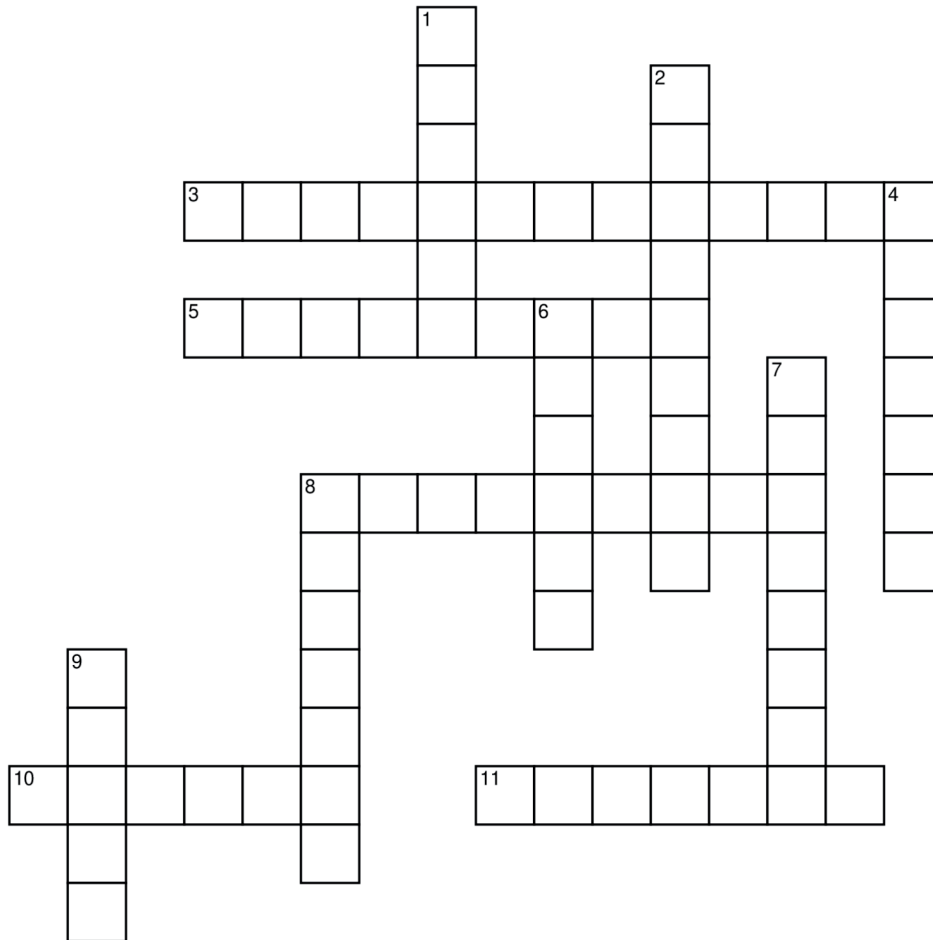
If you get stuck, try asking yourself "Where can I place number X in this row or column?" Scan to see if the number is already in that row, column, or box.
