DID YOU KNOW? Spelman College Named

Rockefeller tithed 10 percent of his earnings to his church from his very first paycheck, and in 1882, John D. Rockefeller began to donate money to the Atlanta Baptist Female Seminary. Two years later, the African American women's school changed its name to Spelman Seminary in honor of his wife, Laura, and her parents, Harvey Buel and Lucy Henry Spelman, who were longtime abolitionists. In 1924, the institute was renamed Spelman College.
