The Vatican Library is a treasure trove filled with ancient manuscripts, rare books, old coins, and works of art. Established by Pope Nicholas V in 1451, the collection has grown through acquisitions, donations, and patronage. With over 1.6 million books, 75,000 manuscripts, and 8,600 incunabula, the library is vast and diverse. Tourists cannot visit the library itself; however, there are other unique tours available in Vatican City that showcase the area's history, art, and architecture.

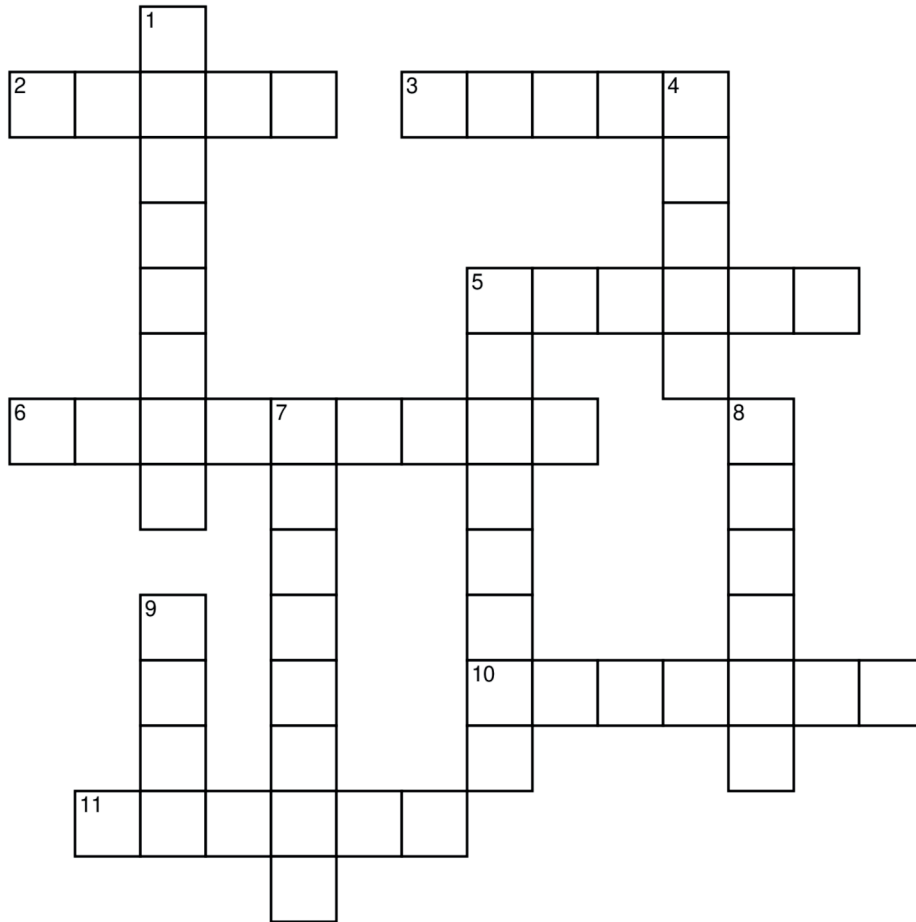

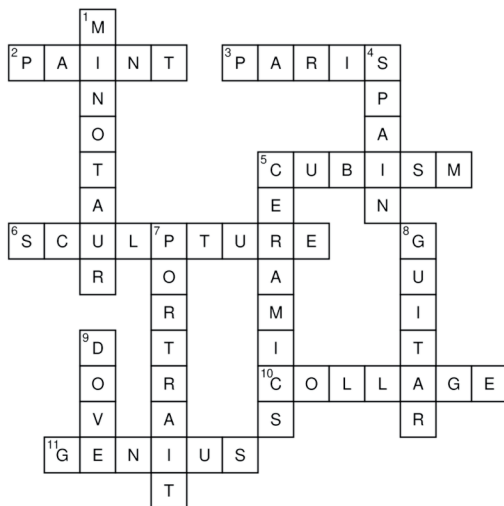
