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## DID YOU KNOW? Color-Popping Marketing

Citrus farmers often cluster oranges in mesh bags, which are made from red plastic. This is not a coincidence; the red bags combined with the orange peels create an optical illusion that makes the fruit appear more appealing to the eye. This technique also works for other citrus fruits such as mandarins, clementines, tangerines, and grapefruits. Yellow citrus, like lemons, is often sold in yellow or green bags to create a similar color-popping effect.

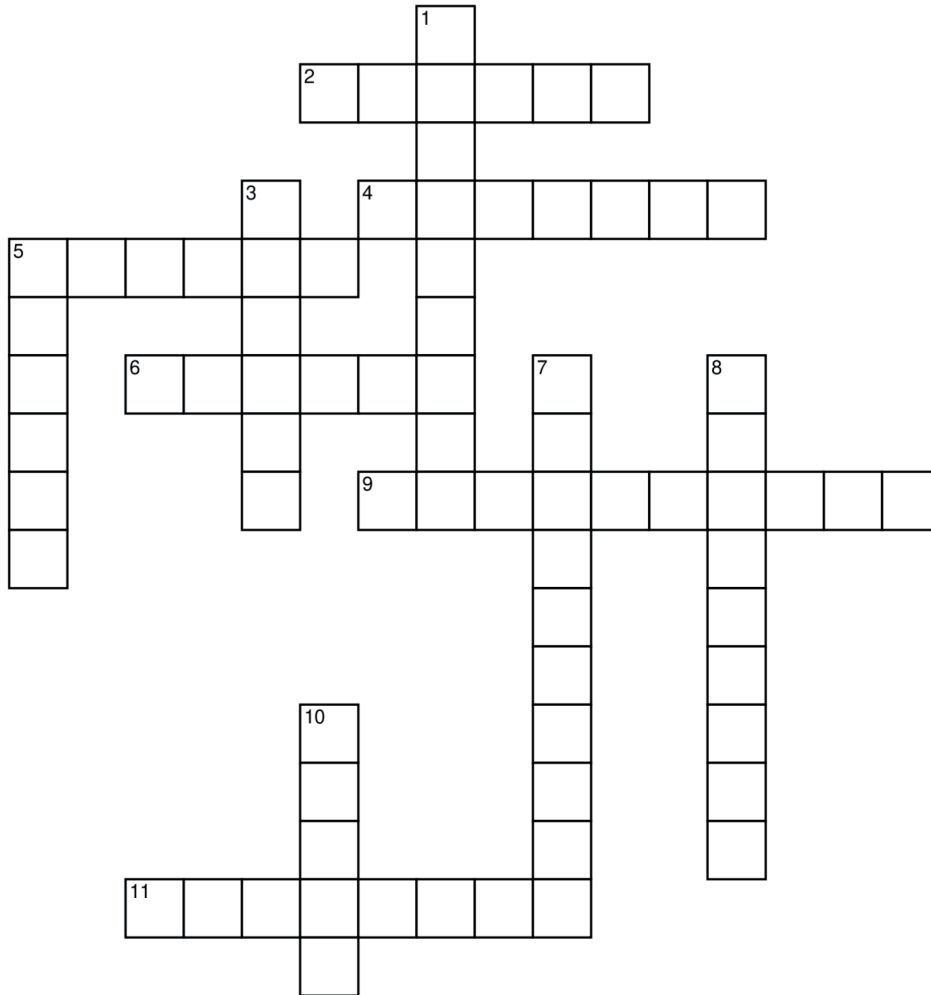

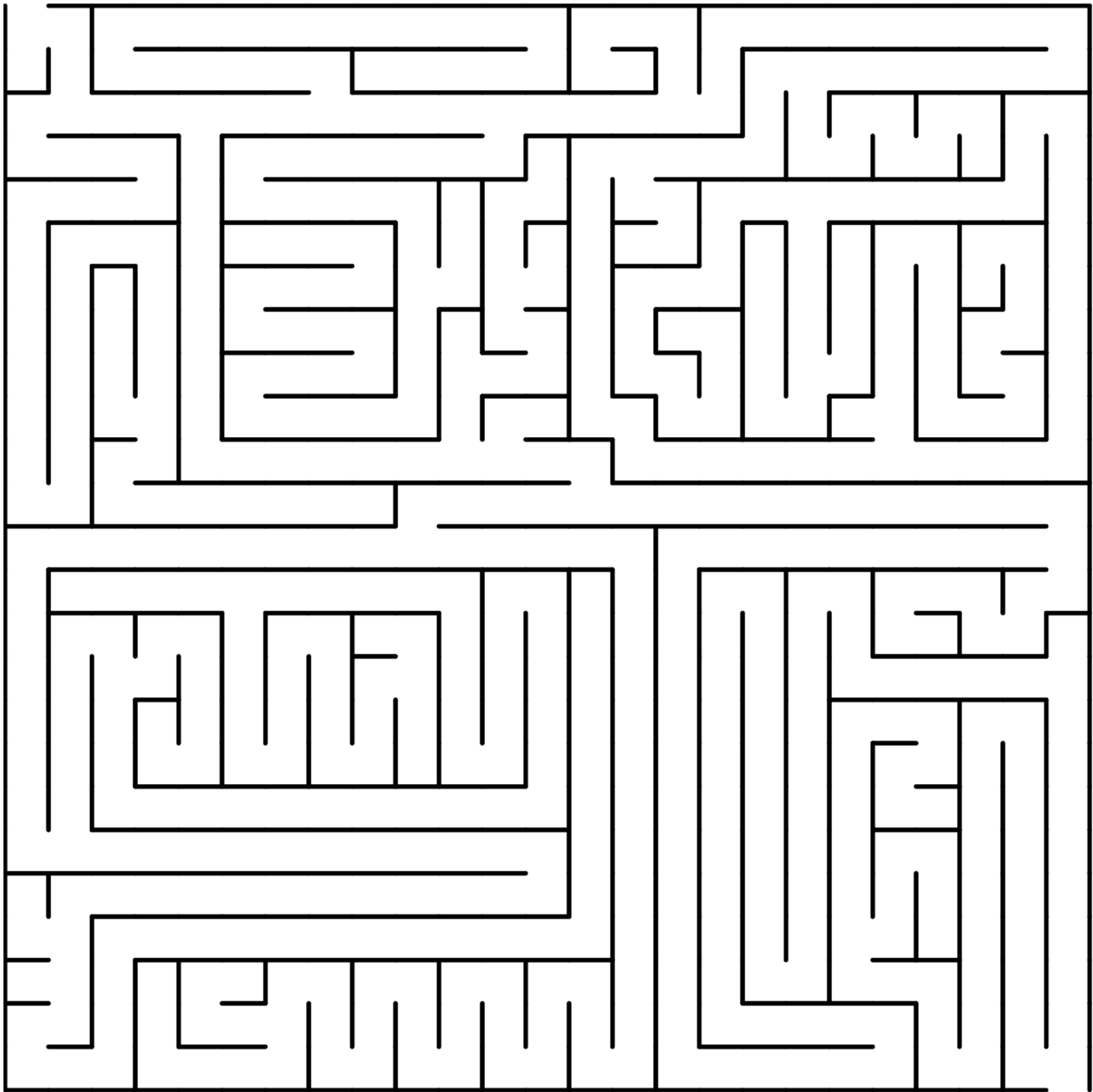
