Reid's Path to Freedom

Philip Reid, an enslaved African American, made a significant contribution to the construction of the Capitol. As a skilled laborer in the foundry run by the sculptor. Reid worked most weeks without a break. He received his freedom in 1862 when President Abraham Lincoln signed the Compensated Emancipation Act. Reid was a free man when the last piece of the Statue of Freedom was put into place atop the Capitol Dome on December 2, 1863.

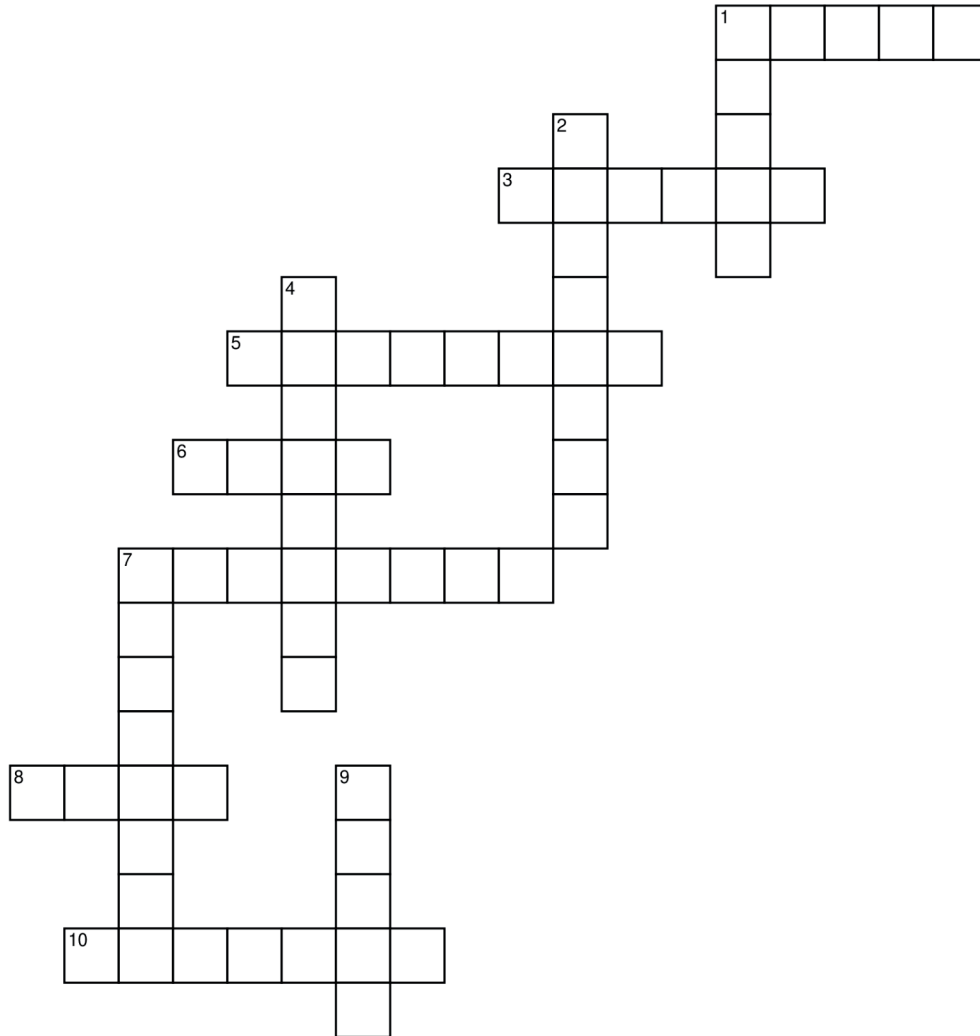
