National Megalodon Day

The ocean is full of fascinating creatures, but none were as fierce as the mighty Megalodon!

Megalodon, meaning “big tooth,” lived millions of years ago and ruled the oceans.

It fed on whales, sharks, and other large sea animals. This massive monster was the largest type of shark to ever live, measuring over 60 feet in length and biting its prey with 276 razor-sharp, seven-inch teeth. And although the Megalodon had six rows of teeth, that’s not a smile you’d want flashed in your direction! Fossils of Megalodon teeth have been found off the coast of North Carolina, home to the Aurora Fossil Museum.

Today, the Megalodon is long extinct, but National Megalodon Day lives on and is celebrated each June 15th.

In 1983, the St. Louis Cardinals traded Keith Hernandez to the New York Mets for Neil Allen and Rick Ownbey. Known for his batting ability, he was the starting first baseman for those two World Series championship teams. He won with the Cardinals in 1982 and the Mets in 1986.

The Talented Tom Wiggins

Tom Wiggins was born into slavery in Georgia in 1849. Blind and autistic, he had an exceptional ability to recreate songs on the piano by ear and memorize tunes after playing them just once. By the age of 10, he had become the first Black musician to perform at the White House and was touring the globe, composing sophisticated works of classical music. He became one of the world's first popular musicians by the turn of the 20th century.

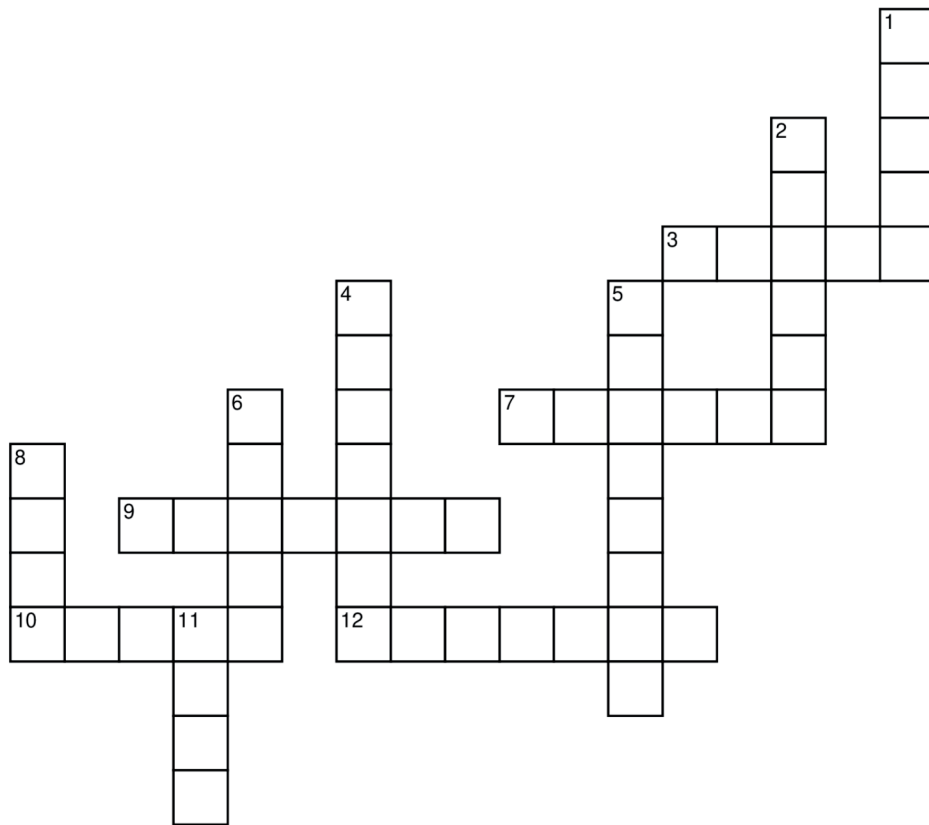
