Daniel Boone Day

Today is Daniel Boone Day, a celebration of the famous outdoorsman known for his explorations in the Kentucky hills. He founded Boonesborough, Kentucky, one of the first American settlements west of the Appalachian Mountains. Daniel Boone was a skilled fur trader and frontiersman best known for leading an expedition of men through the Cumberland Pass, providing access to America's western frontier. By the early 19th century, an estimated 200,000 settlers had traveled through the pass, known as the Wilderness Road. One of these settlers was Abraham Lincoln's father, who resided in Kentucky, the birthplace of our 16th president. Boone is still remembered as an American folk hero and was the subject of a popular television show from 1964 to 1970, starring Fess Parker.



Today in History



In 1975, "Thank God I'm a Country Boy" by John Denver hit #1 on the charts. He recorded and released approximately 300 songs over the course of his life, composing about 200 of them. His songs reached total sales of over 33 million, making him one of the best-selling artists.

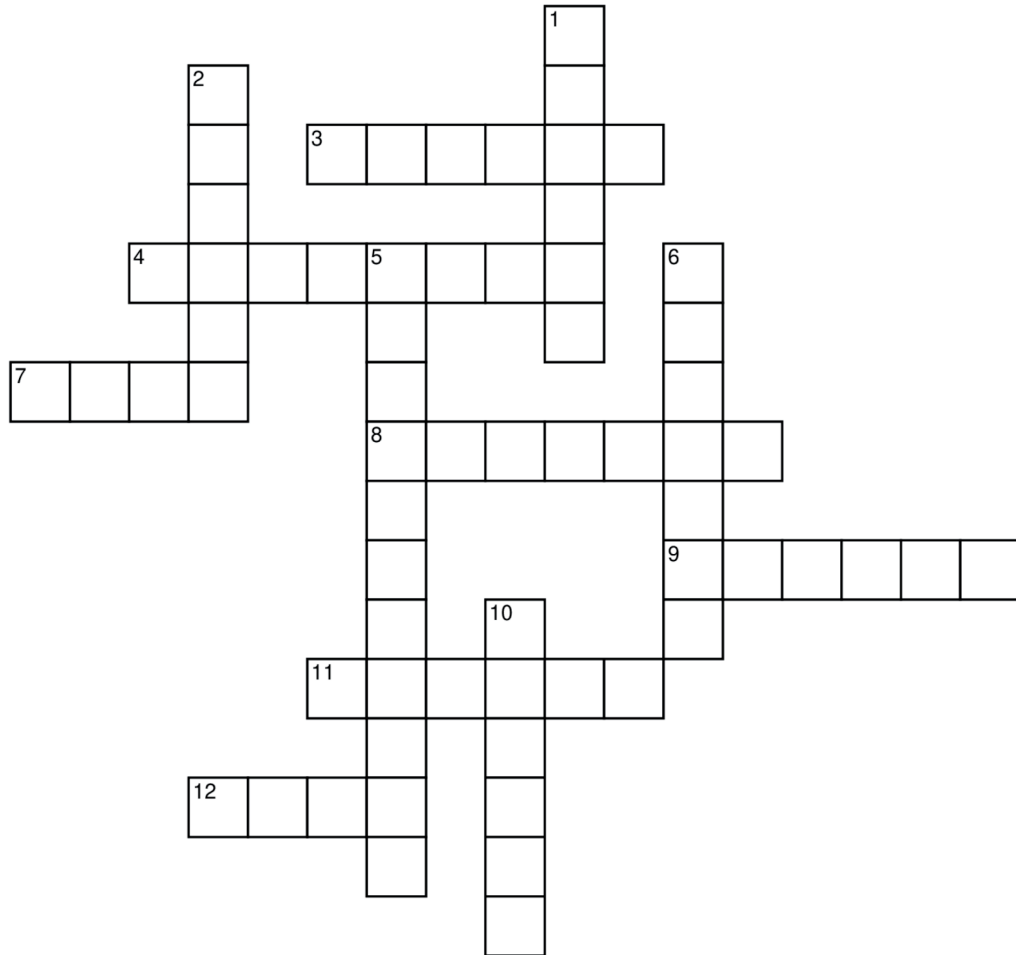

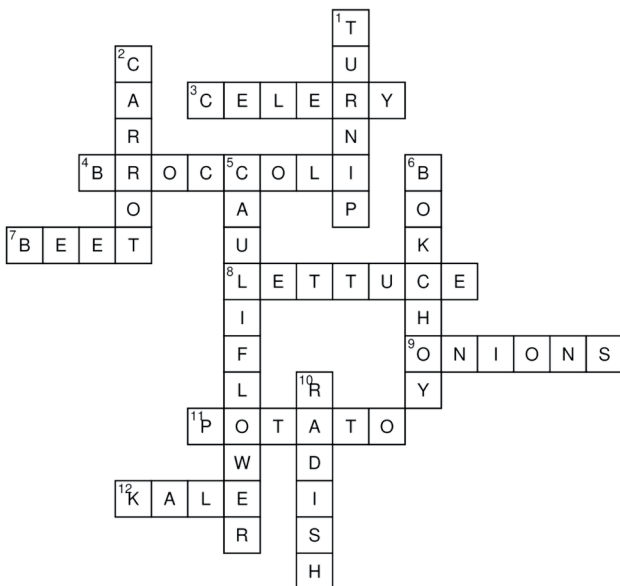
