The Toxic Side of the Moon

Apollo 17 astronaut Harrison Schmitt, the only scientist to walk on the Moon, found out that he was allergic to lunar dust. 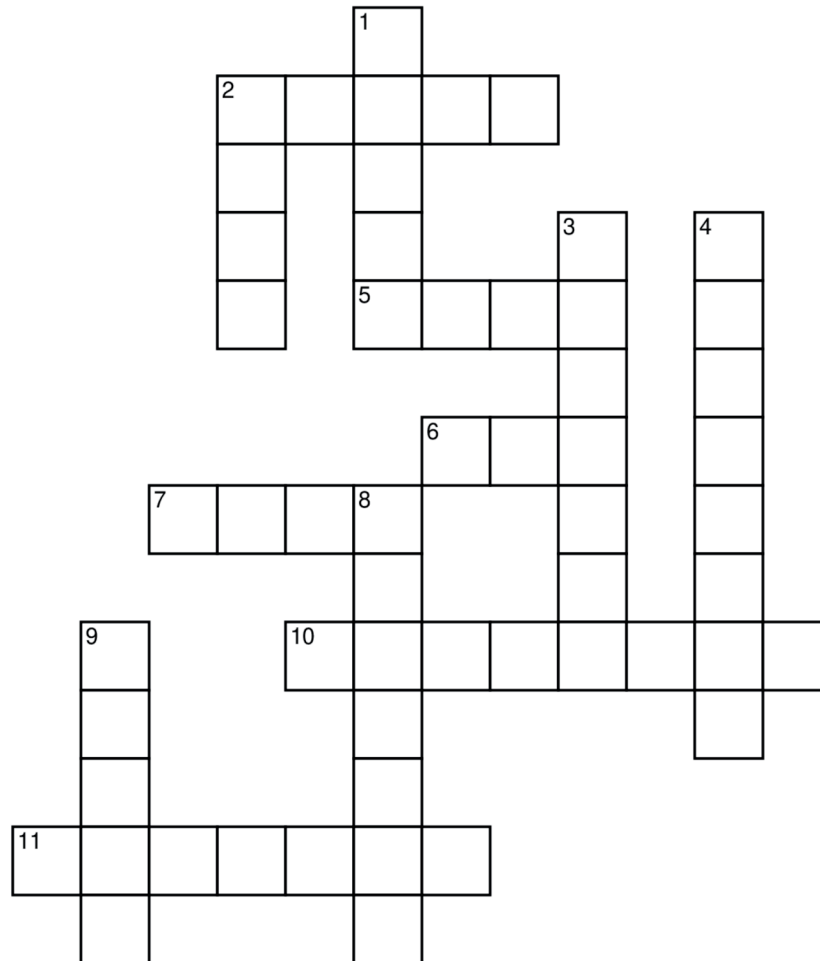

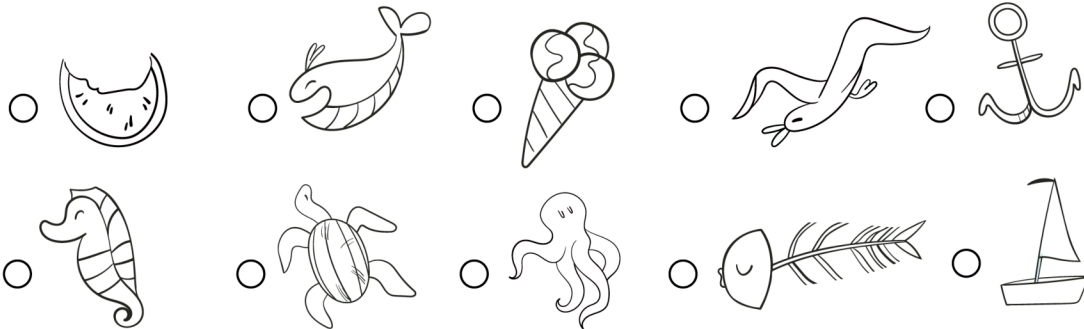

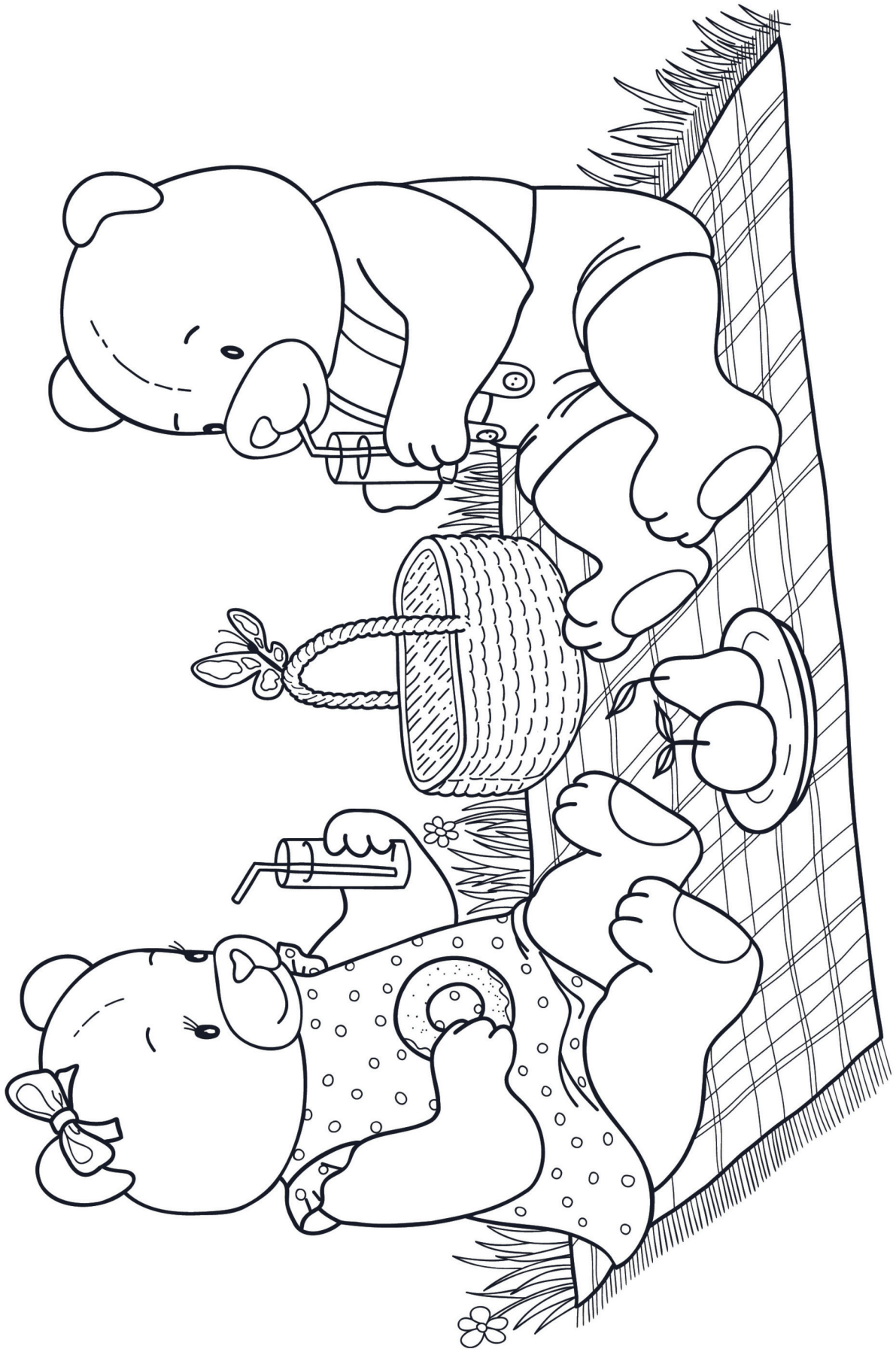
