National Golf Lover's Day

The game of golf traces back to 15th-century Scotland, when players tried hitting pebbles over sand dunes. By the mid-18th century, it officially evolved into a recognized sport with annual competitions. At that time, equipment was a far cry from modern drivers; golfers used simple wooden clubs crafted from beech or hickory, and balls made of compressed feathers wrapped in stitched horsehide. But by the end of the 19th century, golf was popular almost everywhere, leading to the official establishment of the United States Golf Association in 1894. In 1952, the PGA declared October 4th National Golf Day to raise money for charities by encouraging professional PGA members to play golf with contributors. Each year, the PGA continues the tradition by selecting a top-ranked golfer to chair the event.



Today in History



In 1918, Mae West starred in the premiere of the musical “Sometime” in New York City. She performed in vaudeville and on stage before moving to Los Angeles to launch her film career in the 1930s. West’s humor and confident persona made her one of the highest-paid actors in the U.S.

An Act of Generosity

In 1994, Rosa Parks was robbed and assaulted in her home by Joseph N. Skipper at the age of 81. Little Caesars Pizza founder and Detroit Tigers owner, Mike Ilitch began paying her rent every month in a safer place and continued to do so for more than 10 years until she died. He kept the act of generosity a secret until it was discovered in 2014.

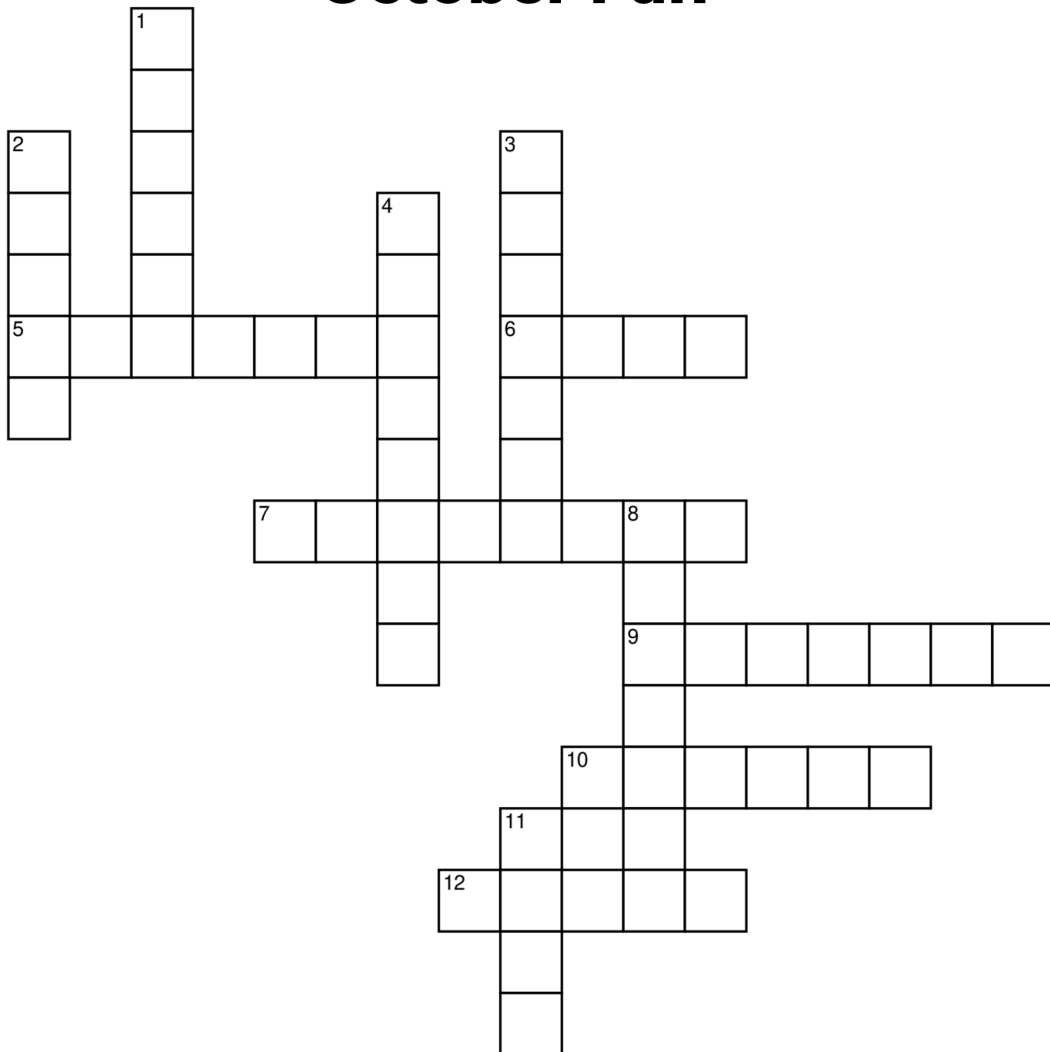

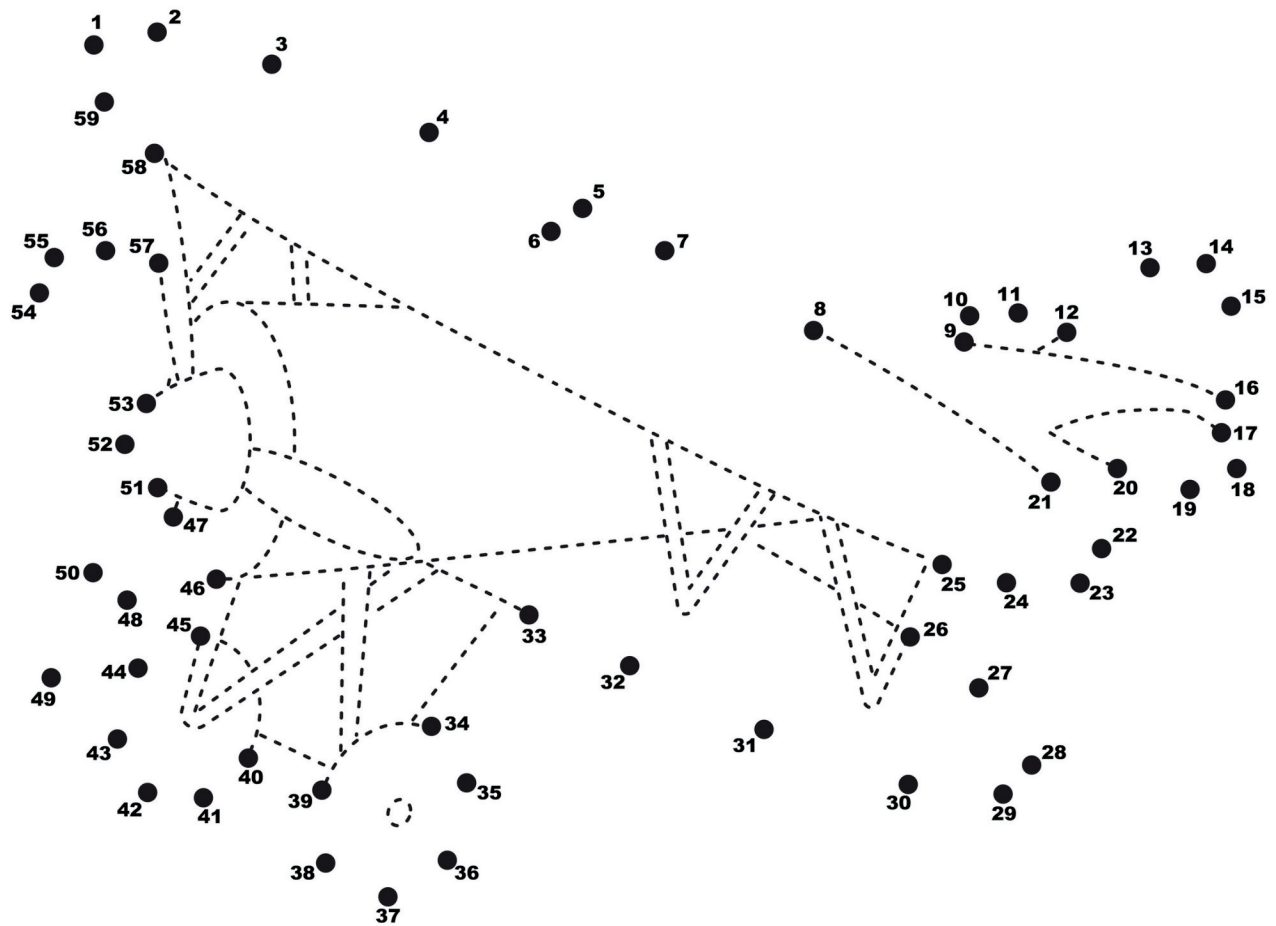
