In 1916, U.S. President Woodrow Wilson signed a bill that prevented a national railroad strike. It was the Adamson Act, which provided an 8-hour day on interstate railroads. He served 2 terms and was responsible for legislation including the Federal Reserve Act and child labor laws.

Prohibition, No Problem

While most were forced to give up alcohol during Prohibition, British statesman Winston Churchill capitalized on an accident he suffered. After being struck by a vehicle in New York City, he experienced great pain; his doctor conveniently prescribed alcohol as a treatment. Dr. Otto C. Pickhardt wrote, "Churchill necessitates the use of alcoholic spirits especially at meal times." Pharmacies often prescribed alcohol as "medicine" during Prohibition due to the lucrative payoffs.

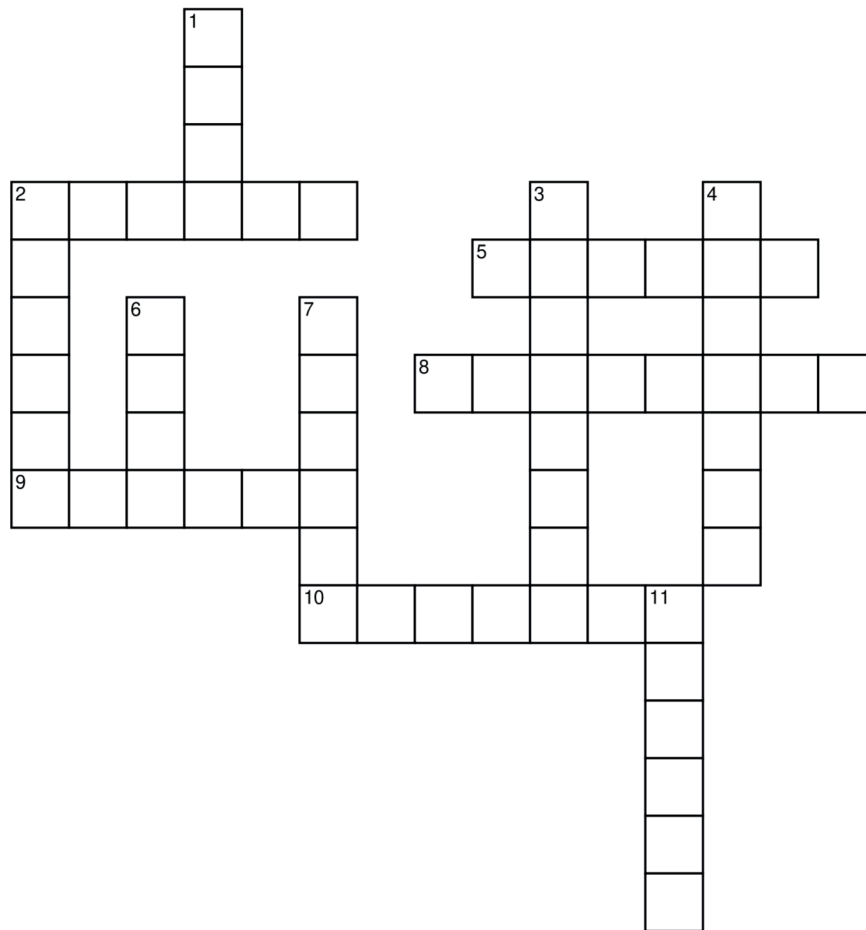

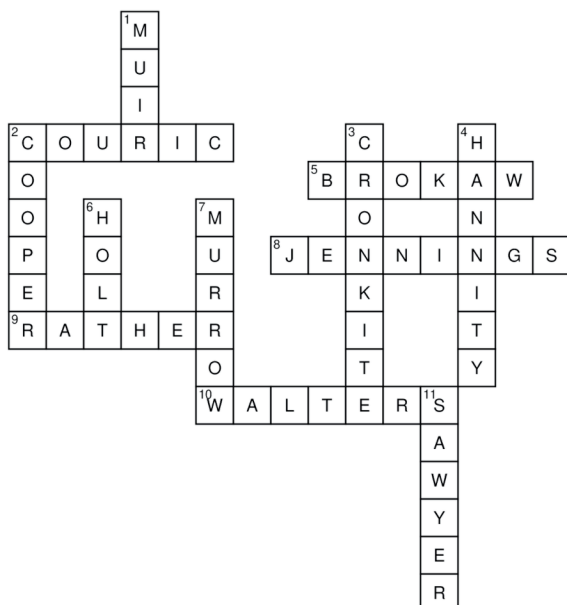
Trivia Answer: B
