Dr. King was highly intelligent and attended Morehouse College at age 15 (he was able to skip 9th and 11th grades) to study medicine and law. He went on to earn his Bachelor of Divinity degree, followed by a doctorate in Systematic Theology. He played football his freshman year and later served as class president and graduated as valedictorian.

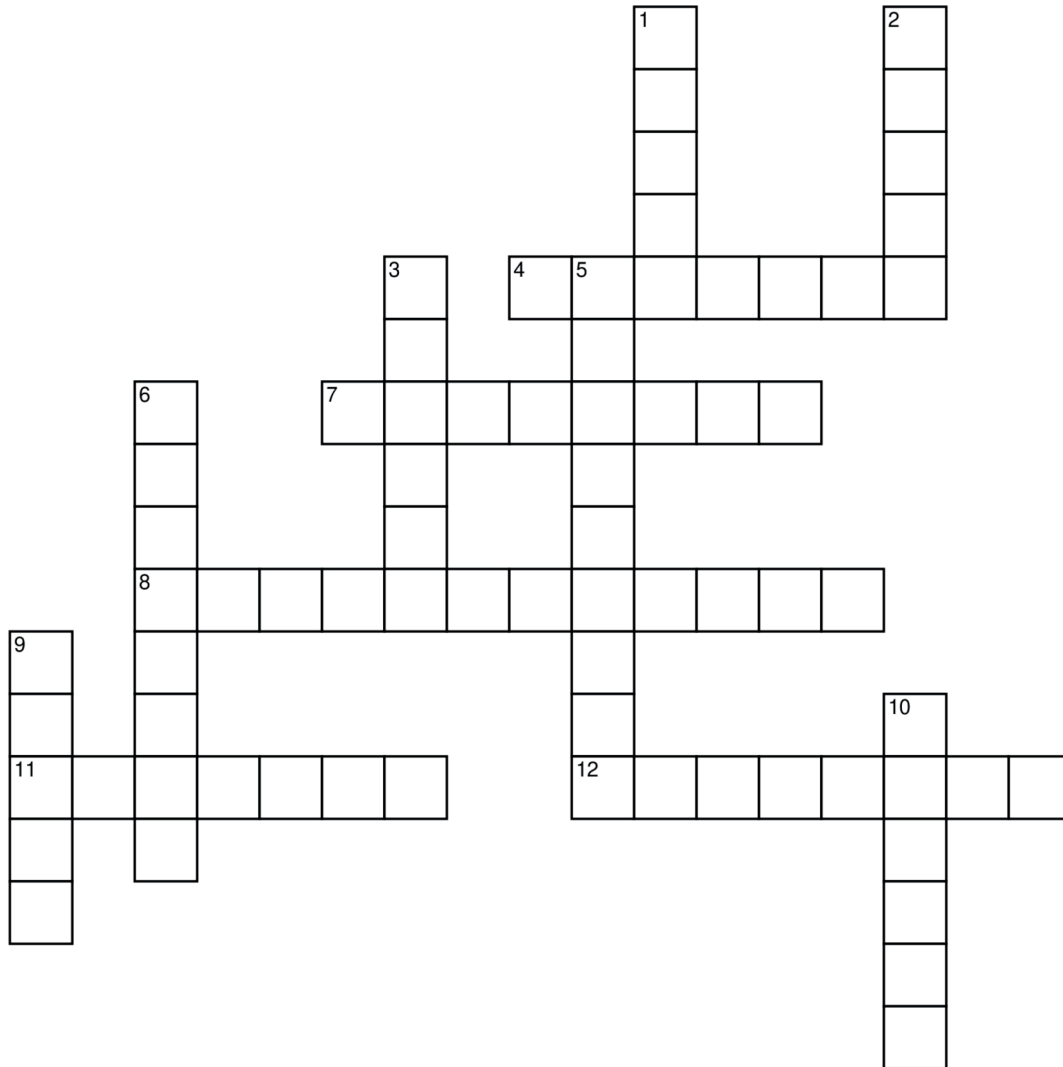

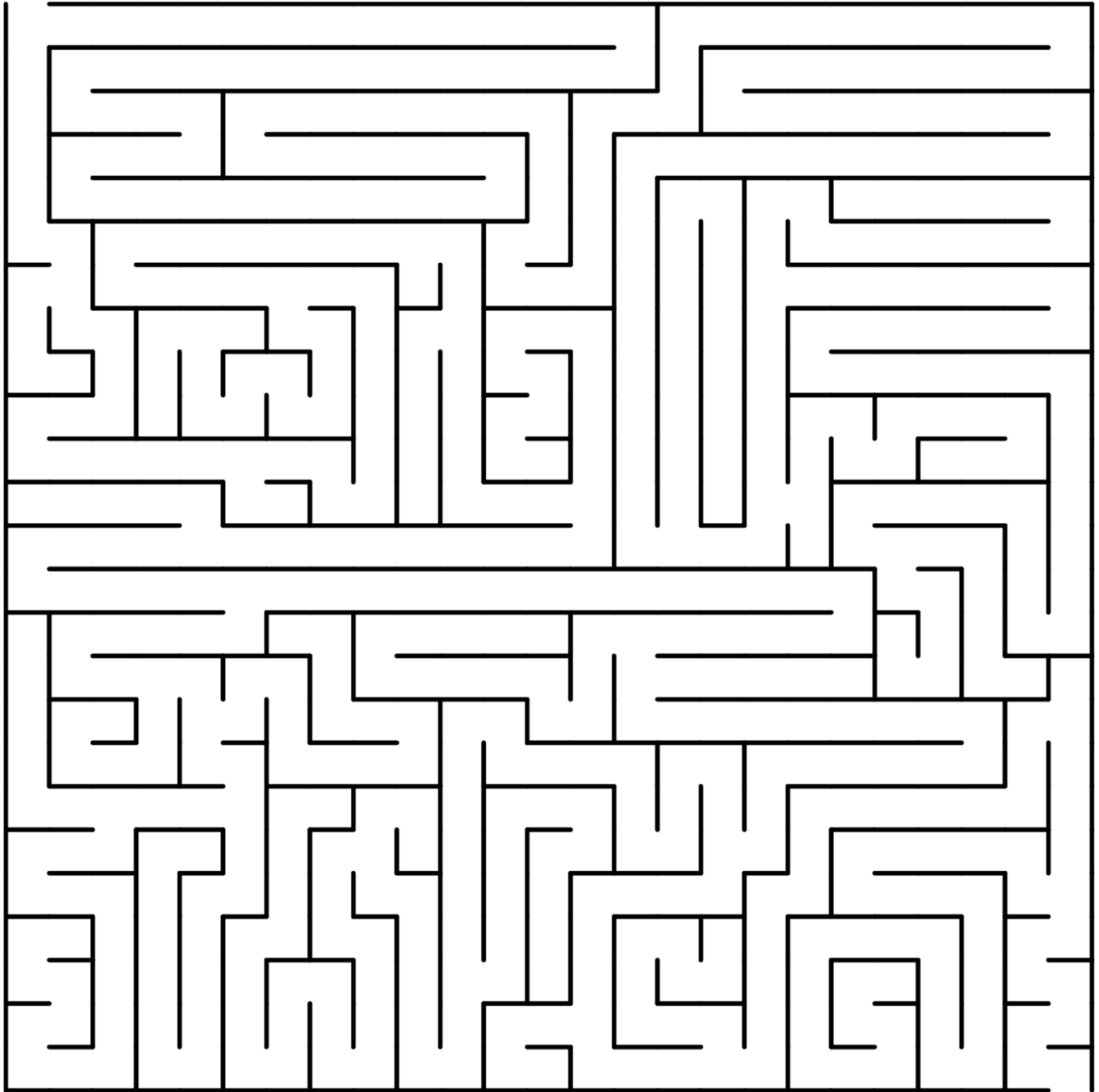

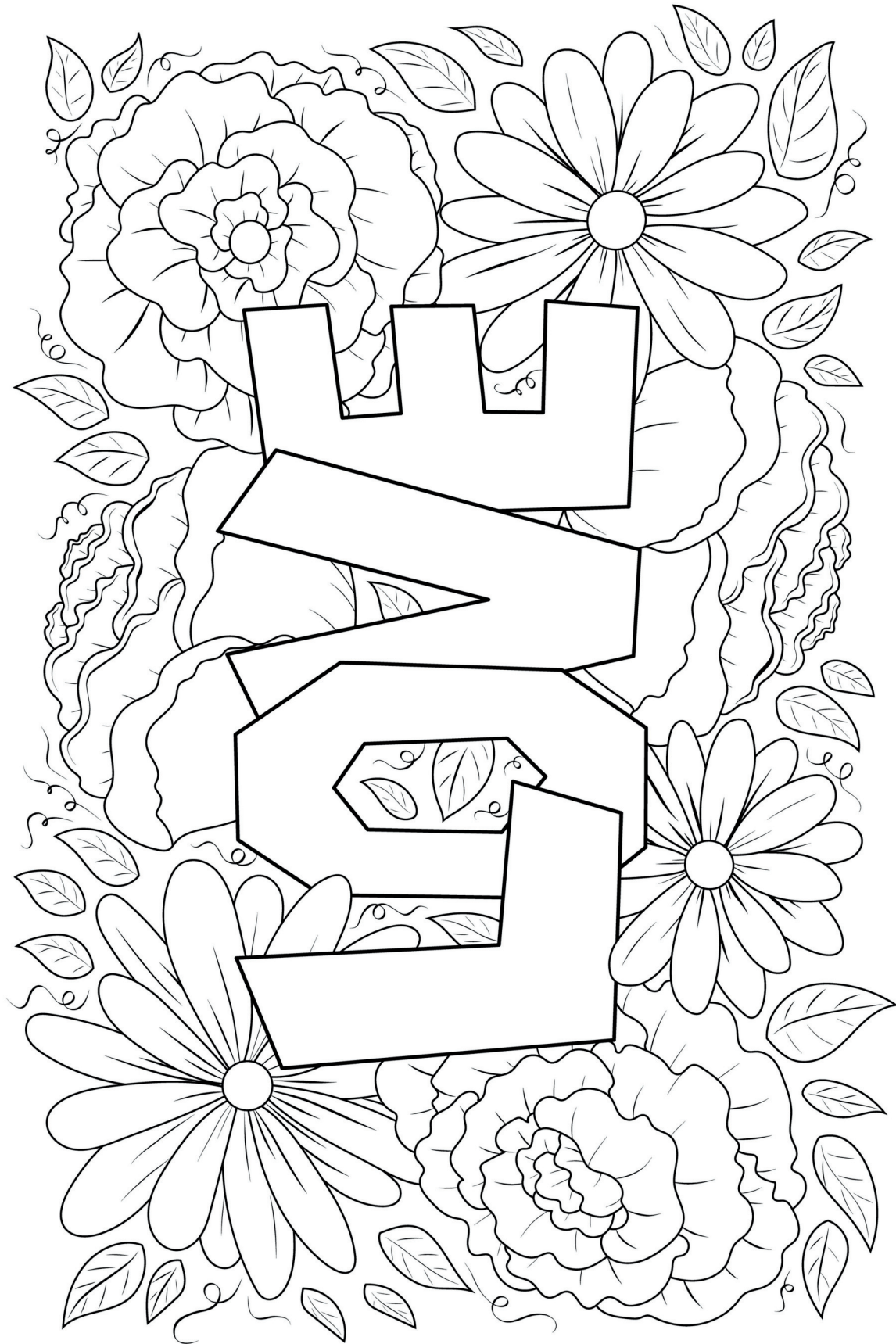
