DID YOU KNOW? Thunderous Waterfall

Victoria Falls, is one of the greatest natural wonders of the world. It is nearly twice as tall as Niagara Falls, plunging 350 feet into a vast gorge. Locals call it Mosi-oa-Tunya, meaning "The Smoke that Thunders," which is a fitting name as the thunderous noise of the falls can be heard from 25 miles away, and its water plume can be seen even farther. Victoria Falls consists of several waterfalls, such as Devil's Cataract, Main Falls, Rainbow Falls, and Horseshoe Falls .

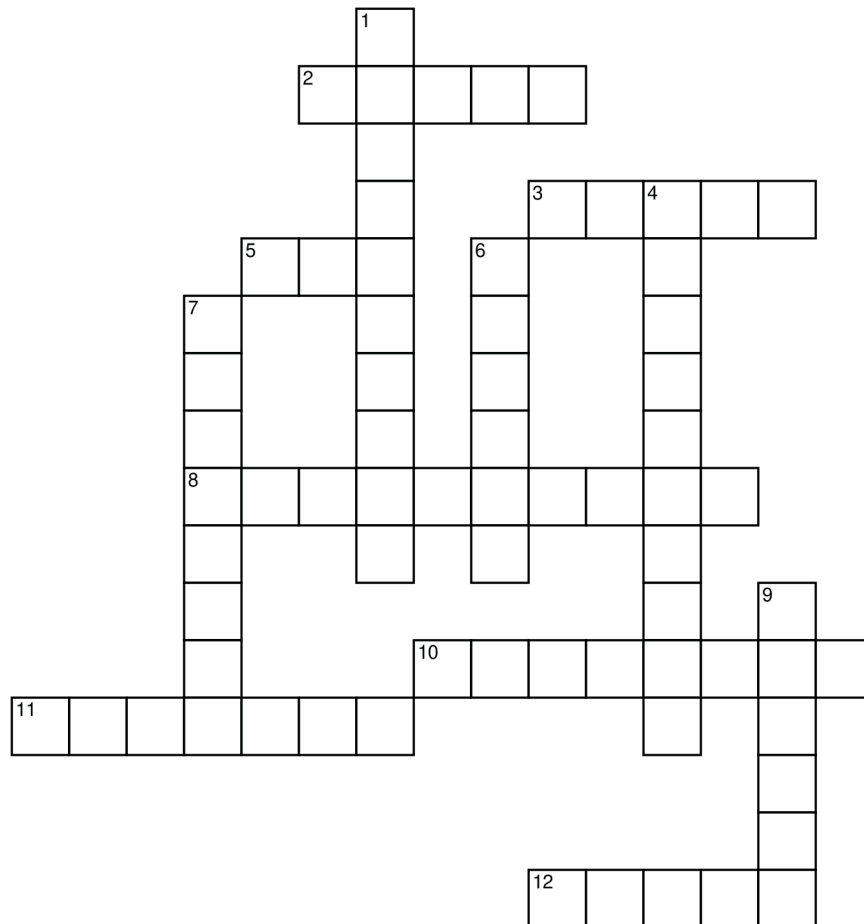

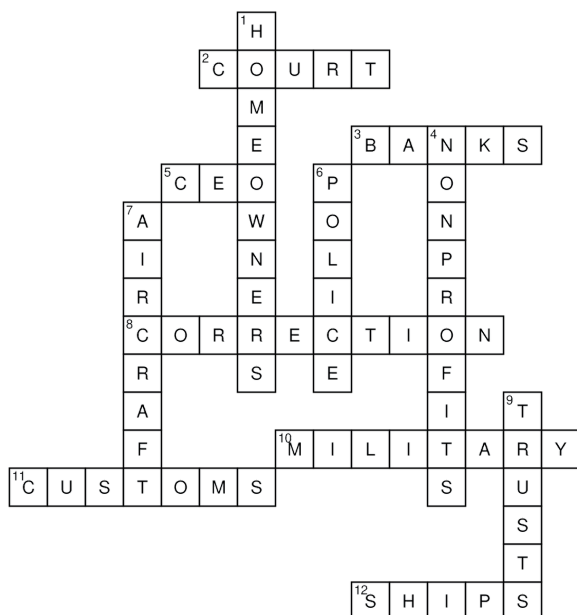
